

Parliament In Congo Gets Power

KINSHASA, The Congo (AP)—President Joseph D. Mobutu handed back to parliament Monday the constitutional powers he stripped from it earlier this year.

Mobutu's surprise announcement was greeted by roaring cheers from legislators jammed into the National Assembly Hall for the official opening of the third session of parliament.

Mobutu said his cabinet now would be responsible to parliament and its committees.

But, Mobutu said, he as president would reserve the right to continue to rule by decree in cases of emergency.

Mobutu took power in a military coup Nov. 24. He kept parliament in power and promised legislators they would serve out their full five-year terms.

When they returned from recess March 4, Mobutu declared that members had used their leave to create trouble in the interior, thus forfeiting their legislative rights. He declared at the time that he would henceforth rule by decree, submitting his laws to parliament only as a matter of notification.

Mobutu said Monday he was returning parliament's powers because the government "needs all good will, a collaboration of all vital forces of the nation, and your entire collaboration."

War With China Possibility Seen

PARIS (AP)—A French business magazine reports that U.S. Defense Secretary Robert McNamara acknowledges a remote possibility of war with China as a result of the fighting in Viet Nam but feels that the danger is of Chinese making.

McNamara's response to questions is reported by the French magazine Enterprise.

Asked about the risk of war between the United States and China, McNamara is quoted as saying:

"We have done everything humanly possible—both military and diplomatically—to make it unmistakably clear that there is no justification for Communist China to involve itself in the war in Viet Nam. Just as our policy in Viet Nam is based upon a disavowal of any intervention to destroy the Hanoi regime or to seize its territory, our policy rests equally—if not more so—upon a rejection of any actions against China."

"Given the history of militant aggressive actions by Communist China, it would be irresponsible for me to say that we run no risk of war with China arising from our efforts to defend South Viet Nam from aggression. But the risk is not created by our operations in Viet Nam; it was created by Communist China."

Soviet Union Blames U.S. For Thant Move

MOSCOW (AP)—The Soviet Union has blamed U.S. involvement in Viet Nam as a major cause for U Thant's decision not to seek a second five-year term as United Nations secretary-general.

It also claimed that the world position of the U.S. is growing more isolated and that this was shown by French President de Gaulle's call for the United States to fix a U.S. troop-withdrawal date as a prelude to Viet Nam peace talks.

The two statements, published Monday in the official government newspaper Izvestia, were the Kremlin's first official reaction to Thant's decision not to seek another term and de Gaulle's speech in Cambodia last Thursday.

Izvestia said that the words of Thant and de Gaulle represent "a mobilization on the international scale of the forces coming out against the American aggression."

In his statement, Thant expressed concern that the Viet-Nam war could spread into a wider conflict. But he did not place the blame on either side.

A U.S. statement issued later recognized that the war "hangs a cloud over world affairs." It added, however, that the U.S. desires an early end to the war and is willing to co-operate in heading off the threat of a major war.

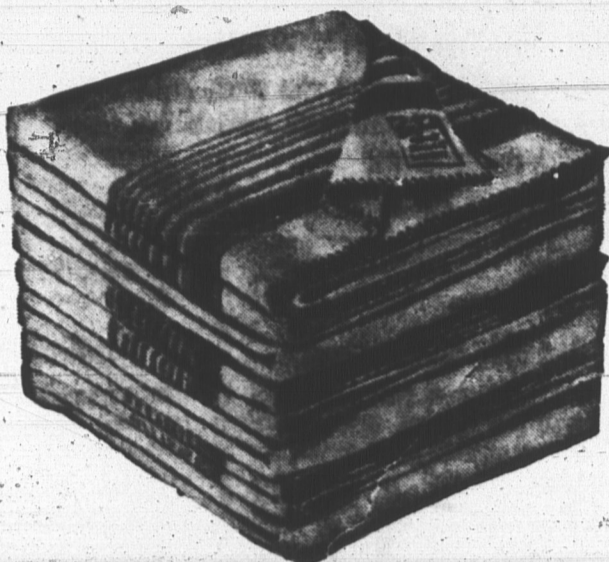
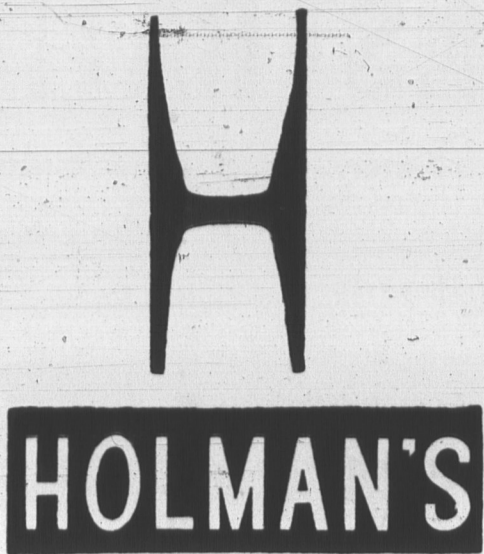
President Johnson said in Detroit Monday he will fix a withdrawal schedule for U.S. forces as soon as North Viet Nam fixes one for its forces.

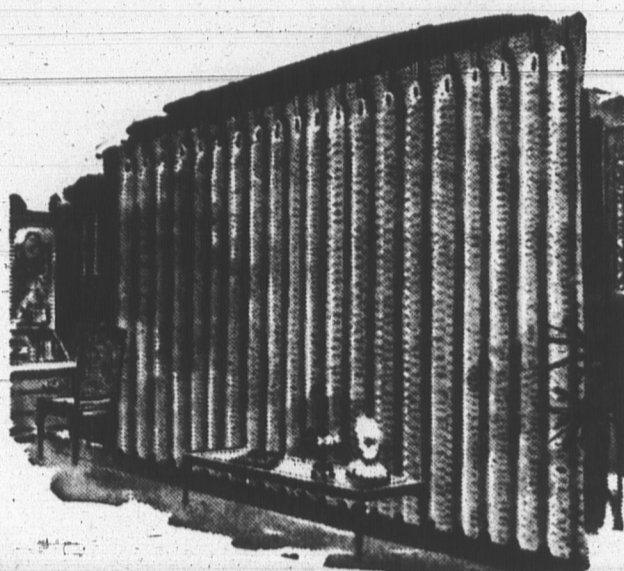

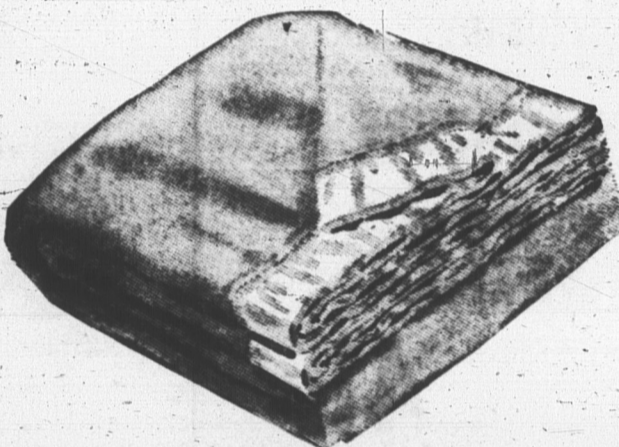

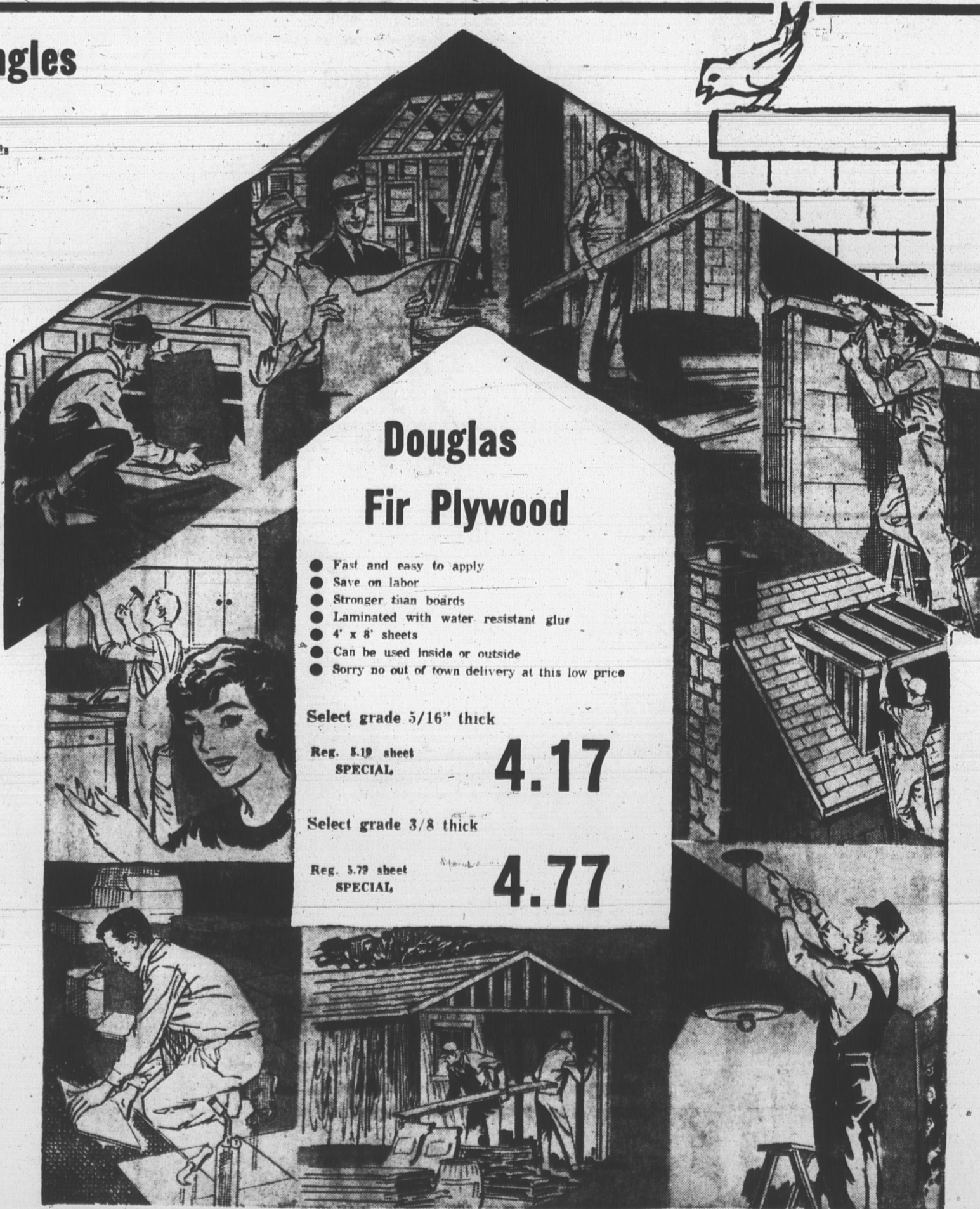
