Freeze Attacks Are Sighted After Airliner Is Hit by Large Gale Reported to Have Taken From Sea

CP from AP-Reuters SHANNON, Ireland - A crippled U.S. airliner with at least 76 persons aboard, 68 of them American servicemen and their dependents, ditched in the Atlantic 50 miles west of Ireland Sunday night. The U.S. naval base at Iceland said it had received a report that nine survivors—seven women and two children - had been placed in life rafts across the Atlantic to Europe.

Argentine President Emerges Triumphant Over Army Rebels

BUENOS AIRES (AP)—President Jose Maria Guido started patching up his shattered government Sunday after emerging triumphant in a rebellion that apparently won him a free hand to run Argentina for the first time.

The last remaining holdouts of the armed forces against him surrendered in north Argentina Sunday morning—bringing complete defeat to military leaders who had staged a puppet last March in their avowed effort to stamp out Peronism, the leftist political movement of former dictator Juan D. Peron.

Pro-Guido forces proclaimed a victorious end to the pocket civil war that had wracked the country since Friday and killed or wounded more civilians by bystanders than soldiers. Casually figures showed 11 civilians were killed and 43 were wounded in two days of spotty fighting.

Garage Riots Damage Is Heavy

VILLE MARIE, Que. (CP)—Thirty-four prisoners rioted at the jail in this northern Quebec community at super-time Sunday night and caused damage estimated at between \$8,000 and \$10,000.

No injuries were reported and none of the prisoners escaped. The trouble started in the kitchen, where doors, windows, tables and chairs were smashed. The prisoners then headed to the second floor and set fire to mattresses in 34 cells and to others piled in the hallway.

The men went to the basement where they shut off the water supply and twisted heating and plumbing pipes out of shape.

Forty armed men - Quebec Provincial Police, volunteer firemen and civilian volunteers - held the prisoners at bay while the fire was extinguished. The prisoners were returned to their cells.

Cause of the disturbance was not known and an inquiry is pending.

Sheriff Jean Paul Healy said he went to the jail during the afternoon to deal with the matter of punishing a prisoner who had been misbehaving. He said the riot broke out two hours after his arrival.

Ghana Emergency Expected To Cancel Visit By Nehru

ACCRA, Ghana (Reuters)—A police announcement was expected Sunday or today cancelling a visit by Jawaharlal Nehru of India because of the state of emergency declared in the country Saturday by President Kwame Nkrumah, informed sources said Sunday.

The sources said J. C. Kalar, Indian high commissioner, has seen Nkrumah to discuss the matter. The Indian prime minister is now in Lagos, Nigeria, but will leave Wednesday for Accra.
