

Spain Banned From U.N. Is Admitted To Unesco

PARIS, Nov. 20 (AP)—Spain barred from the United Nations itself, was admitted to membership Wednesday in another of the UN's many subsidiary organizations — Unesco.

Forty-four of the 65 member-countries, including Britain, Canada, the United States and France voted to bring Spain into the UN Educational Scientific and Cultural Organization.

Four countries, Mexico, Uruguay, Yugoslavia and Burma, opposed her entry and seven abstained. The latter were Sweden, Norway, Denmark, The Netherlands, Luxembourg, India and Israel.

Canada's six-man delegation is headed by Victor Dore, Canadian minister to Switzerland.

Just before the voting, two young Frenchmen jumped up in the public gallery and started hurling abuse at the delegates. They tossed leaflets over the railing.

The leaflets, signed by the French Anarchist Federation, bore

a picture of a smiling Generalissimo Franco, Spain's chief of state in conversation with Hitler and the words: "Have you forgotten that? We do not forget."

The men were handed over to police.

Jose Sebastian de Erice of the Spanish Ministry, heading a group of observers here, took his seat as a delegate after the voting. In a brief speech, he promised Spain would collaborate in every way with Unesco's work.

The UN General Assembly in 1946 imposed a diplomatic ban on the Franco regime, which many countries described as a fascist dictatorship. The ban was lifted in 1950 and members were given the right to decide for themselves whether to send top diplomats back to Madrid.

The UN also voted to allow Spain to join specialized agencies such as the World Health Organization, World Postal Union and Unesco. She now is in six of them. Canada has supported Spain's admission to such agencies.

Get-Tough Policy Adopted Against Alleged Dumping

OTTAWA, Nov. 20 (CP)—The Canadian Government has adopted a "get-tough" policy against alleged dumping of manufactured goods in Canada by two Communist-dominated countries, Czechoslovakia and Poland.

Customs officials have been empowered to increase the value for duty on an imported item by as much as 50 per cent before applying the regular tariff charge. Thus the government will collect the duty plus the difference between the quoted and increased price.

This action stems from steps taken to prevent Canadian officials from inspecting prices in the two countries to see if they are in line with those offered Canadian importers.

Canadian officials say they believe prices in Czechoslovakia and Poland are higher than those quoted to Canadians. It was believed that a wide range of Communist goods were being dumped at abnormally low prices, thus creating unfair competition for Canadian manufacturers and exporters of other countries.

The countries are the biggest exporters to Canada in Eastern Europe.

Exports from Eastern Europe last year totalled about \$7,000,000; \$4,668,000 came from Czechoslovakia and \$1,430,000 from Poland.

The decision to increase the value of imported goods affects such products as women's fabric gloves, woolen piece goods, hats, towels, ribbons and sheet glass.

Here's how policy could work: A shipment of Czechoslovakian fabric gloves valued at \$1,000 might come into Canada and the normal import duty would be 25 per cent or \$250.

The customs officer would boost the value for duty by as much as 50 per cent before applying the 25 per cent duty. The difference between the appraised value and the original import price would be collected as a dumping toll. This would be \$500.

The appraised value would be raised to \$1,500. The 25 per cent duty would amount to \$375 and the total government collection would amount to \$875, more than triple the previous collection under the regular system.

The price tag on the \$1,000 worth of gloves on the Canadian market would be increased to \$1,875, almost double the original price.

Preparing For Traffic Boom For Coronation

LONDON, Nov. 20 (Reuters)—Trans-Atlantic and European airlines and shipping companies are mobilizing their transport in preparation for a traffic boom which will precede the coronation next June 2.

Ships and planes are expected to bring about 1,000,000 visitors to Britain between April and June to see the glittering pageant.

Major transatlantic lines already have scheduled about 80 voyages from North Atlantic ports during the two-month period—30 from Canada and 50 from the United States.

The Cunard Company said Tuesday it will have 11 liners in service. Starting in April its ships, including the Queen Elizabeth and Queen Mary, will make 22 voyages from New York and nine from Canada.

The liner United States will dock at Southampton May 13 and again on May 27. Another U.S. line luxury vessel, the America, will dock at Southampton May 30.

More "Talk" Needed In Proposed Nfld. Projects

LONDON, Nov. 20 (CP)—A spokesman for N. Rothschild and Sons, internationally known banking group, said Tuesday a "lot more talk" will be needed before decisions are made here about financing development in Newfoundland and Labrador.

"We are still in the process of negotiating," the spokesman said. "We are still interested but there are a lot of angles to be explored before we decide to go into development in a big way."

Rothschild sent a six-company mission to Newfoundland in October to report on development possibilities. The mission has since returned with a preliminary report and a Rothschild representative, Peter Hobbs, has been sent to Canada's 10th province for further discussions.

It was understood here that the joint mission sent last month consisted largely of timber and mining interests. The timber men, it was said, "can see trees growing already" but the mining groups are a little more cautious.

The six companies are the Anglo-American Corporation of South Africa, the Anglo-Newfoundland Development Company, Newfoundland Pulp and Paper Mills, Ltd., the English Electric Company, Froisher Ltd., a Canadian mining company, and the Rio Tinto Co. Ltd.

The Rothschild Company was built by the famous German Jewish banking family. The founder was Mayer Anselm Bauer, 18th-century money-lender who did business at the sign of the "Rothschild" German for red shield, in a part of Frankfurt where houses were identified by colored shields rather than numbers.

Perhaps the most famous member of the family was Bauer's son, Nathan Mayer Rothschild, who was carrier pigeons and fast boats to obtain information for financial operations. By these means the company is said to have been the first to hear the result of the Battle of Waterloo.
