Universal City Is Promoted For World Fair

MONTREAL (CP) - Louis Dostie, 37-year-old Lovell executive, said Thursday his idea for creating a "universal city" in suburban Duveroy could mean an additional \$500,000,000 in tourist dollars during the six months the 1967 world fair is on.

Mr. Dostie heads a citizens' committee of nine advertising executives trying to promote the idea. They have been working for six months getting the scheme down on paper.

Paul Vienvien, commissioner-general of the world fair, says the idea is one of the most interesting submitted so far to the board of directors.

The committee approached the directors June 5, asking them to use their channels to sell the idea to nations who will be participating in the exhibition. The directors are considering the proposal.
