'WAR AND PEACE' A GREAT FILM TO-DAY

If it is at all possible to make a simple statement about a three-hour, twenty-eight minute motion picture it would have to be said that "War and Peace" which bows today at the Capitol Theatre, is one of the great films of all time. HALIFAX (CP)—RCAF search and rescue officials here said the body of the pilot has been found inside a Northern Wings Air Lines helicopter wrecked in Southern Labrador. The pilot was not identified. The helicopter was missing since

Wednesday when it took off from Dooley Lake for Carroll Lake. Dooley Lake is about 120 miles south of Knob Lake, the Quebec iron mining centre. The pilot's body was flown to Knob Lake Saturday by an RCAF helicopter. Northern Wings headquarters is at Sept Isles, Quebec. Company aircraft and RCAF planes said the 'copter was found in rugged country near Dooley Lake.
