

THIS IN RUSSIA!

St. Petersburg Effort to Suppress Drunkenness.

PARIS, April 12.—The international temperance congress held lately in this city has attracted considerable attention. The discussions of the congress have given prominence to the radical and despotic measure of the St. Petersburg municipality to suppress or check drunkenness. The city government has arbitrarily closed 25,000 dram shops, substituting 5,000 under state control, wherein the variety of liquors and the amount sold is to be strictly limited.

A Bishop's Strong Protest.

LONDON, April 13.—At a meeting held on Tuesday afternoon at Exeter Hall in celebration of Church Missionary Society's Centenary, the Right Rev. George Rodney Eden, D. D., Bishop of Wakefield, created a sensation by attacking the Sunday newspapers issued for the first time here on Sunday last, and also making an attack upon Puerro's play, "The Gay Lord Quox," saying:

"Christian work has never been more necessary than in the week which has witnessed the desecration of the Lord's Day by the publication of a leading daily with a review of the most immoral play which has ever disgraced the stage of this country."

On the Safe Side.

OTTAWA, April 12.—Acting on advice from the Yukon, the Minister of Militia has decided to make a change in his proposed recall to the regulars of Dawson and Fort St. Klirk. Dr. Borden decided a fortnight ago to recall all but about fifty of the forces of 203 regulars now in the district, but it is now the intention to leave a round hundred at the gold fields. Sundry American roughs have made threat against the Government officials and laws abiding citizens, and though the Militia Department authorities have no fear of any lawlessness, it is considered better to be on the safe side.

Vaccination and Leprosy.

OTTAWA, April 13.—The report of Dr. Smith, inspector of leprosy, which appears in the report of the Minister of Agriculture, states that, including three Icelandic patients, there are today in Tracadie, N. B., Lazaretto 21 intimates, 15 males and 6 females, representing all stages of leprosy. Five are in the first stage, 11 in the second and 5 in the final. The ages vary from 11 to 65. During the year there were two deaths, and three new cases were admitted. Dr. Smith says that in recent years there has been a notable diminution in leprosy in the Dominion. Discussing the general question of the spread of leprosy, he says that vaccination against smallpox is a frequent cause of propagation of the disease. In Mexico and the Sandwich Islands after a general vaccination numerous leper centres were developed. He urges that Canada should not neglect every safeguard to prevent the introduction of this disease from Hawaii to the Pacific slope.

Crisis in Jamaica.

KINGSTON, Ja., April 13.—When the Legislative Council resumed its sessions on Tuesday, the Governor, Sir Augustus Hemming, read a statement making an absolute and unconditional surrender, withdrawing the additional members, restoring the constitutional status quo ante and appealing to the representatives to accept the right hand of fellowship to allow by-gones to be by-gones, and announcing that he relied on their patriotism to aid him in solving the difficulties.

Thereupon the representatives withdrew the vote of censure of the Government passed on Friday last, and voted \$500,000 to meet the immediate liabilities, pending the rearrangement of the finances of the island.
