J. Embree of Halifax as its new president, succeeding Mrs. W. T. O'Brien of Ottawa. Other officers include Mrs. Tancrede Jodoin of Montreal as french vice-president and Mrs. A. L. Caldwell of Saskatoon, Sask., as english vice-president.

Mrs. Embree former vice-president of the federation, is the mother of three grown children. She has been in political work for years.

In an interview after her election, she took a belt at minority political parties, particularly the Social Credit, which she called "a peculiar type of Fascism."

She also came out for more women in political positions, though she said the federation is not "demanding" this.

"We do want more political positions," she said, "both appointed and elected but we do not demand—we expect to work for them."

In reports from provincial federations the national group was told by the Quebec body today that women should have a larger place in politics.

Mrs. Jodoin said the Quebec federation asks that:

Women be given a greater share in Liberal deliberations; women be permitted to form riding organizations; more women be elected to the Commons; more women be appointed to government commissions.

From Nova Scotia, provincial president Mrs. G. C. Atkinson of Westbrook said women have political assets which are not always recognized.

"We are, on the whole, less entrenched in tradition less hide-bound than men," she declared.

Mrs. A. F. Brown of Winnipeg, president of the Manitoba federation said steps are being taken in that province to bring more women into political work.

are going to produce strong differences of opinion.

Potato Licenses

Advertisements have appeared in the daily press listing agents authorized to accept licensing fees from potato growers.

For this year at least, licensing is the only available method of raising funds for promotion and advertising of the industry. Growers who realize the value of the business (and who doesn't this year) will in making their contribution be taking a practical step towards protecting their own future.

The payment of license money should be looked upon as a sound investment rather than an obligation. Certainly the payment is an obligation, but is nevertheless an opportunity for betterment.

Hog Floors

The announcement by the Price Support Board that the floor price of 51 hogs is to be lowered to 42.00 the first of the year does not necessarily mean that prices will go down to this level.

Price levels at that time will be influenced by supplies on hand and in prospect and it is quite possible that 1953 could see a gradual strengthening of the hog market.

Canners and Cutters

A Government offer, some ten days ago, to purchase boned-out beef from the packers at \$35.50 a hundred resulted in a strengthening of prices at Moncton on the poorer grades of cattle amounting in the case of heavy bulls to \$4.00 a hundred on a dressed basis, with a corresponding increase on live prices. This week has, however, seen a weaker tendency.

Price levels which do not relate directly to sales by the farmer are difficult to assess and the price of \$35.50 covering as it did meat coming from four or five different classes of cattle is difficult to apply back to the farmers return. Eventually, cattle producers will face the necessity of bringing some system into the selling of their cattle which at the present time are sold under systems which give the farmer no bargaining power.

He is survived by his widow, the former Dorothy Adelaide Anderson of Ottawa; one son, William S. Tyndale, Montreal lawyer, and two daughters, Mrs. Michael Goodfellow, of Langley Village, Buckinghamshire, England, and Miss Ann Louis Tyndale, with the British diplomatic service in Cairo, Egypt.
