

O'Brien Drives Prince Jay To New World Record For 1 1/8 Miles

ARCADIA, Calif., June 5 — (AP) — Prince Jay broke the world pacing record for 1 1/8 miles Saturday as he won the \$5,000 San Diego Pace before 10,365 harness-racing fans at Santa Anita.

The four-year-old bay travelled the distance in 2:15 1/5, breaking the mark of 2:15 1/4 set in 1934 at Salem, N.H., by Calumet Durbique.

Little Joe O'Brien, the veteran New Glasgow, N.S., and Alberton, P.E.I. reinsman, brought Prince Jay down the stretch under strong urging and held off a belated bid by Dr. Stanton to win by a neck. The favored Jerry the First was third in the field of seven.

Dr. Stanton was driven by his owner, Lindy Fraser of Forest, Ont.

The impressive score established Prince Jay as a definite threat for the \$50,000-added Golden West Pace June 17.

The winner, owned by C and C Ranches of Shafter, Calif., paid \$7.40, \$3.50 and \$2.20. Dr. Stanton paid \$6.40 and \$2.40, and Jerry the first \$2.10.

O'Brien drove horses in four other classes, winning one race, placing second in two and third in the other.
