Magic Ice-Box Cake

Combine 3/4 c. melted shortening and 1 c. light corn syrup. Beat in 2 eggs. Sift together 2 c. sifted all-purpose flour, 4 tps. Magic Baking Powder, 1/2 tsp. salt; add alternately with 3/4 c. milk and 1 tsp. vanilla extract to first mixture stirring well after each addition. Bake in 2 greased 9" layer pans in 350° oven 25-30 min. Cool, halve each layer lengthwise making 4 layers.

LEMON FILLING: Blend 4 1/2 tbs. flour with 1/2 c. water to make smooth paste. Add 3/4 c. water and 1/2 c. corn syrup. Cook, stirring constantly until thickened. Beat egg yolks; gradually add cooked mixture to it. Return to heat; cook 1 min. Stir in 1 tbs. lemon rind, few grains salt and 1/4 c. juice. Spread filling between layers and on top of cake. Chill. Top with white icing.



Annual Meeting Grand River C.W.L.

Mrs. Neil McLellan of Grand River C. W. L. stated in her president's report, that Grand River had forty-three paid up members in their "League", nine monthly meetings, and one special meeting were held during the year, with an average attendance of ten members. Supplies were bought for the general clean up which was held in June, and a new Tabernacle well and ciborium covers were also purchased. A delegate from the Sub-division attended the annual convention held in Charlottetown.

Dances sponsored by the League in aid of parish funds, were held at intervals throughout the summer and cards were held during the winter months for the same purpose.

Two successful dances were held during the year to help swell the "League" funds, and much credit is due the ladies of the parish for their generous contributions of both food and money which made our pantry sale the grand success it was.

The pastor was remembered with a gift at Christmas, and a gift of money was also sent to a student from the parish attending St. Augustine's Seminary. Boxes of fruit, etc., were packed at Christmas, for the sick and shut-ins of the parish, these generous treats were kindly donated by two members Mrs. Angus Gillis and Mrs. Willard Gillis. Cod liver oil capsules were purchased in quantities from the Red Cross, and sold to the school children in the different districts of the parish.

The hall was cleaned several times during the year, and the church was cleaned before Easter. "We are very grateful to one of our members," she continued, "Mrs. Joseph MacDonald, for her exquisite hand-made lilies which she so generously donated to adorn the Altar at Easter, and also for the beautiful roses which she made to replace the lilies after the Easter season."

The parish was canvassed and a generous amount collected for the St. Dunstan's girls' Scholarship fund. The diocesan dues were paid, and donations of money were sent to the following—The "Prince County League Room" in the new P. C. Hospital; St. Vincent's Orphanage, St. Martha's building fund, Sisters of Martha, T. B. League Sisters of Service, and the Princess Alice fund.
