**POLICE COURT** — In the City Police Court yesterday morning before Magistrate K.M. Martin, a Charlottetown man found guilty of assault was sentenced to three months in jail, and a drunk and incapable female was committed to jail for ten days without option. Two speeders were fined \$10 and costs or ten days and another traffic violator who ignored a red light stop signal was also fined \$10 and costs or 10 days.

Under the Excise Act, a resident of Mt. Stewart charged with possession of spirits had his case adjourned for a week.
