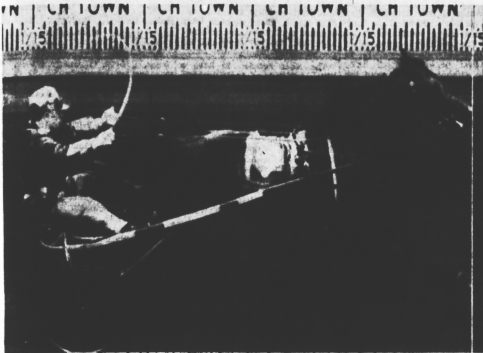


# 1957 ❖ MARITIME HARNES RACING REVIEW ❖ 1957

He took a record last year of 2:08 and had winnings of \$8,234. He was a member of the S. A. Wathen and Son Stable, Fort Fairfield, Me.

Bernie Dan, a 3-year-old gelding by Lusty Song 2:03 1/2, dam, Brewer's Maid, by Bill Gallon 3, 1:59 1/2. He was up to a mile in 1:39 1/2. This season, has perfect man, perfect man and his breeding should be a very fast trotter. New owner, Jack Brown, Charlottetown.

Alva Hanover, a yearling filly by Nibble Hanover, dam, Lee. She was bred at Hanover Shoe Farms and has an exceptional pedigree on both sides. New owner, Elliott Saunders, Lexington, Mass. 2:06 in 1957, by Nibble Hanover 2:03 3/4. This horse was Star's Pride 1:47 1/2, dam, Lark Hanover's 2:10 3/4. Section Man was a winner on the Grand Circuit. This season and was 2:10 in the second division of the Ham Safford Hanover 2:08 3/4, Saltra Hanover 2:08 3/4 and four others and the 2:02 1/2, earning \$10,800 in his hat classic. Elliott Saunders, Lexington, Mass. is the new owner.

try fair. He started 30 times, 9 times first, 14 times second and three times third. His last start was at Maywood, where he was potted out on 2:07 for first. He is eligible to the 2:19 pace. Should be a good proposition for our Maritime raceways.

Dark Yankee 1, 2:17, by Yan-2:05 1/2 and Dark Yankee, her first two foals. She is by Woody Boy 2:03 1/4, one of the best sires of speed. This 2-year-old mare is described as a good trotter that made 23 starts and was only six times out of the money. She is eligible to the 2:28 class.

Stalag Hanover 3, 2:08 4/5, 3, 2:06 in 1957, by Nibble Hanover 2:03 3/4. This horse was foaled in 1954 and was bred by this mare and has been timed in miles of the world's greatest, and 2:08 4/5 were purchased by Ed. Lincolnton of Newcastle, N.B. The latter mare is by High Volo 2:01, one of the best sires in the midwest, and the dam is Winnie Dillon 2:11, dam of four with records better than 2:10. She should be a good addition to our racing ranks.

Mac and Bruce Lawson also purchased the following at Delaware: Success Vice, p. 2:07, the winner of 12 dashes this year, also two seconds and four thirds. He is only five years old and did his only over half-mile tracks.

Colby Rose p. 2:10 2/5, did not do much racing this year, because of an attack of virus. Last year in 29 starts he was only three times out of the money.

Doctor Pease p. 2:07, record taken over a half-mile track. He was raced at Chicago and has paced right at 2:08.

Len Queen purchased Ireland Hal, a 2-year-old pacer by N.D. Hal, dam, Purified Norma, from

Lee McKenney of Lewiston, Maine.

P.J. Downey, Hillsboro County, N.B., purchased two, Blaze Ensign 1, 2:08 1/2, a 2-year-old pacer by Ensign Hanover 1:59 4/5, dam, Tiny Grapes 2:04 1/4, dam, three with records better than 2:08 2/5. She is by that great speed sire Bonycastle 2:05 1/2, and Professor Pick 2:07 1/2, a 6-year-old pacer by Direct Brewer 4, 2:04, one of Ohio's best sires of speed. His dam is Abba's Abbey p. 2:08 1/2, and Professor Pick is her first foal. She was among the honors accorded the Camp string during the season was the naming of the stable's last pacer Diamond Hal 1:57 4/5 as the aged pacer of the year. Among the performances that drew votes from the turf writers in their selection was his second consecutive victory in the National Pacing Derby and his two wins in the \$40,000 Canada Pace series in Montreal, and his 1:59 4/5 performance in the first leg of the \$75,000 American Pacing Classic in the famous derby at Roosevelt Diamond Hal paced the mile and a quarter in 2:31 1/2. For several years the featured driver away from home has been Joe O'Brien, and he still continues to fill that spot in the limelight despite accidents and happenings that would have daunted a less resolute person.

To begin with, in the early part of the year he had prepared the champion trotter Scott Frost 1:58 2/5 for another brilliant campaign, only to find that after winning a heat at Hollywood Park, Calif. from some of the fastest trotters in the world, he pulled up lame and training had to be discontinued. Joe also suffered from the handicap due to injuries he received in a smash up the previous fall and he had to get around with a cane.

One of the biggest stunts any driver pulled was when Joe on October 24 won the Class A Pace at Hollywood Park with Razlie Dazzle in 2:03 4/5. That night he flew to New York and the next evening drove Adios Express to a win in the first dash of the \$100,000 Messenger take for 2-year-old pacers. Joe later that night caught the plane for California and was on hand in the afternoon of the 28th to drive Diamond Hal in the Free For All Pace, purse \$5,000, which the Hal horse won in 1:59. The same afternoon Joe drove Scott Frost in the Free For All, purse \$5,000, to win the first place heading north of the world's fastest trotters in 2:00
