DALMAHOY, Scotland (AP)—Fred Haas, 50-year-old insurance man from New Orleans, won the world's senior golf championship Sunday by defeating Dal Rees of Britain 3 and 2 over the Dalmahoys links near Edinburgh.

Rees, 53, is a former captain of the British Ryder Cup squad. The match was played over 36 holes on the 6,667-yard par-72 course, 25 miles from Muirfield where the British open championship begins Wednesday.
