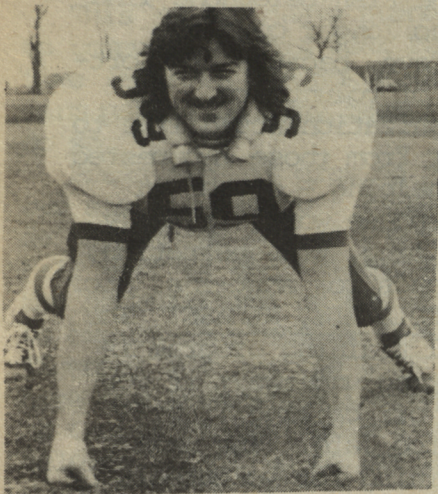


Panthers Make All-Conference Four Named to Dream Team

The UPEI Football Panthers have had four players named to the Atlantic Conference All-Conference squad after balloting this past weekend. Heading the list are fifth year players Mike Lyriotokis and Frank Costa, while Hubert (Socky) MacDonald and Dan Desjardins are the others named.

Lyriotokis, a defensive tackle, was a unanimous selection to the squad and a strong contender for All-Canadian honors. Mike was also selected outstanding lineman in the AUFC and has been nominated for the J.P. Metras Award, awarded to the outstanding lineman in Canadian College Football. Lyriotokis, who is the defensive team captain for the Panthers, returned to UPEI this past season after attending the Ottawa Roughriders training camp last summer. 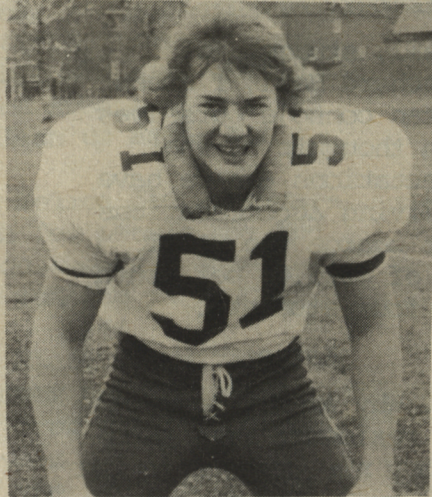
Thane A. Campbell, the first Chancellor of the University, died in Ottawa last month at the age of 83. He was installed as Chancellor in May 1970 and due to illness resigned in 1974. He was a former Chief Justice before his appointment to Ottawa as Chief Commissioner of the Foreign Claims Commission. A native of Summerside, he had a long and distinguished academic and political career.

He earned B.A. and M.A. Degrees at Dalhousie University and as a Rhodes Scholar, received his L.L.D. at Oxford University where he attended Corpus Christi College. He received honorary degrees from Dalhousie University and St. Dunstan's University.

Danny Desjardins Desjardins called the defensive plays in the huddle this season.

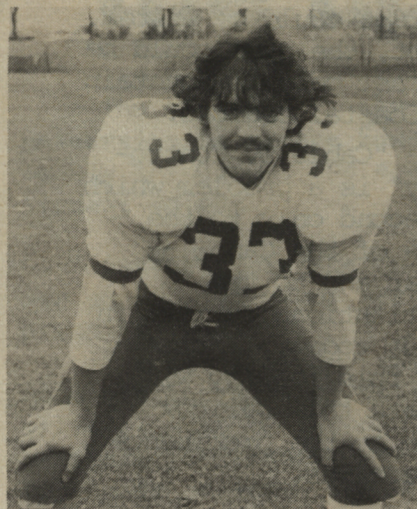
Socky MacDonald was the only Islander selected, and the only All-Conference player who played for his home-town club. A three-time All-Conference selection at defensive halfback, Socky had four interceptions this season, third in the league behind St. Mary's' Brian Burgess and UPEI's Dave Connaughton who had six and five interceptions respectively. This versatile graduate of Colonel Gray Senior High School was usually assigned to cover the opposition's best receiver man-to-man. As an

to the bar in 1927 and practiced in Summerside until 1943. He was first elected to the legislature in 1931 and upon the death of Premier Walter M. Lea became Premier. He held that office until 1943 when he resigned to accept the appointment of Chief Justice, a position he held for 27 years.

The former UPEI Chancellor was a member of the Boards of Governors of Dalhousie University and St. Dunstan's University.

Besides his wife, he is survived by two daughters, Virginia and Harriet, and two sons, Melville and Alexander B., former Premier of the Province.

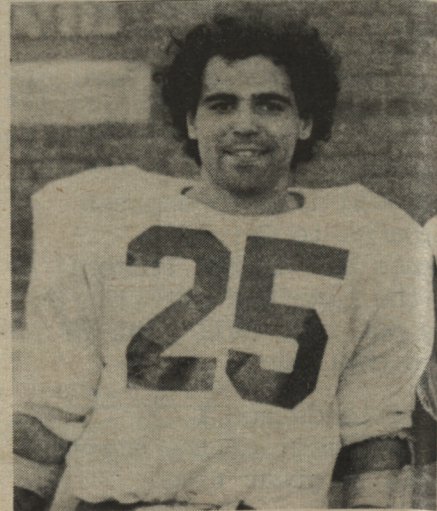
A memorial service was held at Trinity United Church in Summerside, with burial in People's Cemetery.
