SAILED FOR PORTO RICO.

General Miles With Some Troops

SAILED YESTERDAY ON THE CRUISER YALE.

The Campaign to be Made Short and Decisive.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.]

WASHINGTON, July 19.—General Miles who is to command the Porto Rico expedition, sailed yesterday with some artillery and troops for Porto Rico, on the cruiser Yale.

He will be followed quickly by about 3000 men.

The purpose of Secretary Alger is to make Porto Rico campaign a short one.

An overwhelming force will be thrown upon the Island and it is possible that a bloodless victory will be achieved, when the Spanish become convinced that they have no reasonable chance to resist successfully.

The expedition is to comprise 30,000 men at the start and it will be soon swelled to 40,000 men, and if necessary to 70,000 men.

ACCIDENT TO THE PRINCE OF WALES.

Fractured His Knee Cap by Slipping.

LONDON, July 19.—While passing Sunday at Wade's Manor, Aylesbury, the Prince of Wales slipped on the stair and sprained his knee.

While being conveyed to the railway station in a chair, the latter broke and his Highness received a shaking up.

A bulletin issued tonight at Marlborough House, the London residence of the Prince, says he has fractured his left knee cap.

REBELLION IN CHINA.

Defeat of the Imperial Troops.

HONG KONG, July 17.—The defeat of the Imperial troops near Woo-Chow is confirmed. Thousands of bodies have been recovered from the river and have been buried at Woo-Chow. The losses of the Imperial force are probably more than 1500 killed, which was the number first announced.

It is reported here that the Chinese doctor, Sun Yat Sen, who was inveigled into the Chinese embassy in London in 1896 and imprisoned there until he succeeded in notifying the British Government officials, through a friend, that he had been kidnapped, is among the leaders of the present rebellion.

It is said the rebels have decided not to advance farther than Shue Hing, above Sams-Hui, fearing foreign complications in the event of Canton being attacked. The credibility of this report is questioned, as the inhabitants of Canton are greatly in sympathy with the rebels.

Shot Fired at a German Cruiser.

ADMIRAL DEWEY WILL STAND NO NONSENSE.

German Cruiser Irene Interfered With His Harbor Rules.

LONDON, July 19.—The Hong Kong correspondent of the Daily News says:

United States Consul Williman informs me that the German cruiser Irene was passing Manvels, off Manila, the other day, the U.S. gunboat Hugh, McCulloch, was sent after her to ask her to stop.

As the Irene refused to obey, a shell was sent across her bows and a small boat went to discover what she was doing.

The German admiral protested and insisted that German ships had a right to enter the harbor without being searched, a claim which Admiral Dewey declined to recognize.

It is reported that Admiral Von Die-drichs, who is in command of the German squadron at Manila, interviewed Captain Chichester, of the British cruiser Immortalite, as to what he would do if the Germans interfered with the bombardment of Manila.

Captain Chichester replied that only Admiral Dewey knew himself.

KEEPING UP THEIR RECORD

Americans Have BombarDED Manzanillo.

AND STRANDED SEVERAL SPANISH GUNBOATS.

Several Steamships in the Harbor set on Fire.

LONDON, July 19.—A special despatch from Havana dated Monday says: Seven American war-ships heavily bombarded Manzanillas this morning.

Three steamers of the Mandez line were set on fire.

Several gunboats that were in the harbor issued forth for defence of the town but stranded.

The result of the bombardment is not yet known here.

Men and Money Come to Victoria.

DEATH OF THE YUKON OUTLAW

VICTORIA, B. C., July 17.—The steamer Cottage City brought down last night about twenty men, who left Dawson City about June 8th, travelled to White Horse Rapids, and transferred their steamer to the head of Lake Bennett. They bring about three-quarters of a million dollars in dust and paper, mostly the latter. They say that the banking accommodation at Dawson is now so good that there is no necessity for men bringing out money in any other form than drafts. The Canadian Bank of Commerce, and the Bank of British North America are storing dust for shipment via St. Michael's in boats of the transportation companies. Among the men believed to have most money on the Cottage City are the Rutler brothers, of Ellsworth, Minn. The eldest went in three years ago, and the other three last year. They have cleaned up a large amount on Bonanza Creek, and now hold the claims. An English syndicate is represented by McFarland and Coleman, the latter of whom came down last night.

The price obtained cannot be learned, but Coleman, who is thoroughly reliable, is authority for the statement that it is a very large one.

All the men on board refused to state the full amount of money brought out. Several of them have been working only on day's wages at \$15 a day.

The health of Dawson City was good, and no lawlessness exists. The mounted police are giving great satisfaction.

Exceedingly good strikes have been made on New Bench, Eldorado, Bonanza, French Creek and Skokum Gulch, which are reported to be enormously productive at high levels. The quartz claim prospected so far yield poor prospects.

"Soapy" Smith, the notorious desperado, was killed on July 8th by the City Engineer of Skagway on the wharf at that place. "Soapy's" gang had robbed a new arrival from Dawson of \$2,700, and a meeting of citizens was called to devise some means of obtaining a return of the money and rid the town of "Soapy's" gang. "Soapy" proceeded to break up the meeting, armed with a Winchester rifle. At the entrance to the wharf the City Engineer had been deputized to guard against interruption, and he resisted "Soapy's" intrusion, with the result that the latter struck him with the end of the rifle. The man closed and "Soapy's" rifle went off severely wounding the guard, who immediately shot him through the heart with a revolver. "Soapy" died instantly and at the inquest held subsequently the engineer was exonerated on the ground of self defence.
