

3 Double Dash Winners In Local Harness Action

The fight will be televised by Sports Network Inc., starting at 10 p.m. ET.

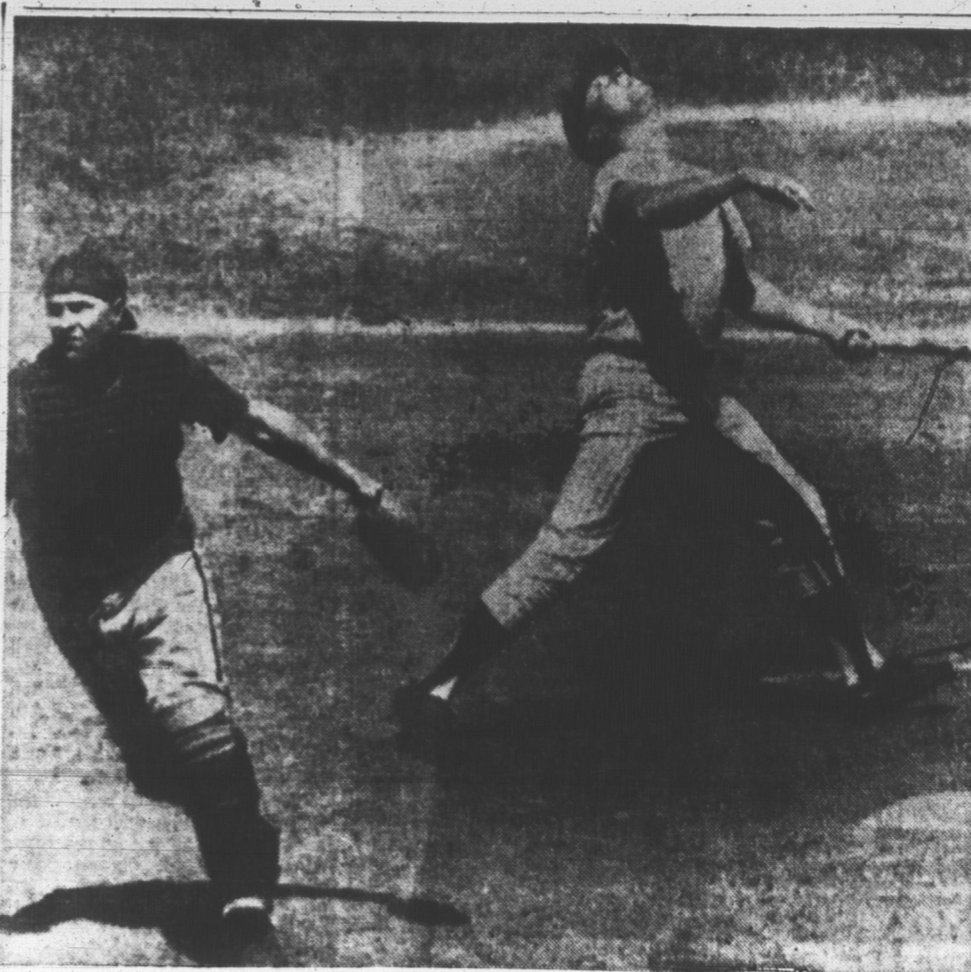
Torres has scored 36 knockouts in 39 fights and has been stopped only once.

Mays' blast with a man on base in the opener snapped a scoreless tie in the sixth inning and left him only one short of second-place Jimmy Fox on the all-time homer list.
