Fulton Sees Bicultural Federal Role

HAMILTON (CP) — Former Justice minister Davie Fulton says the federal government should sponsor French language educational and cultural centres for any province that wants them.

Speaking here at the Ontario division of the Young Progressive Conservative Association, Mr. Fulton said the government should pay 100 per cent of the capital cost of such centres and 75 per cent of operating costs.

The centres at first should be limited to elementary French education with the provinces having full freedom in deciding where they were to be located.

Mr. Fulton said the system would be particularly useful in provinces, particularly British Columbia, where there are no classes for French-speaking children in public schools.

"If a French-Canadian moves from Quebec to another part of Canada he must virtually give up being a French-Canadian. These language schools would give the French-Canadian families a place to send their children no matter where they lived."

The most important role for the federal government in education is to work out an agreement with the provinces, setting out national priorities.

Earlier, delegates heard a proposal that the federal government should take over from the provinces control of French-language rights outside Quebec.

A paper from the conference's Confederation committee proposed special committees be established in French-speaking areas to take over control of education, including the French-language University of Ottawa and the French-language section of the University of Sudbury.
