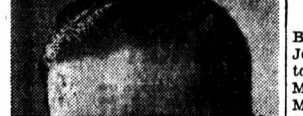

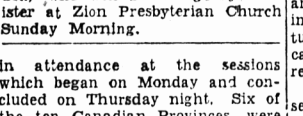


Rev. D.A. Campbell, New London, who will be the guest minister at Zion Presbyterian Church Sunday Morning.

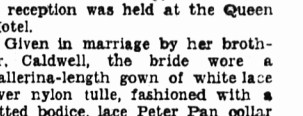
