SOURIS — Eight cases were on the docket here yesterday as a regular session of the Kings County magistrate's court. Magistrate James B. Johnston, QC, presided. The crown was represented by J. Arthur McGuigan, deputy attorney-general.

Joseph William Deveau, Sr. of Souris, charged with impaired driving had his case adjourned to Dec. 11. No plea was taken.

Michael Francis Macdonald of Little Harbor, charged with possession of liquor not purchased from a vendor, was fined \$25 and costs or 30 days. In a second case the same defendant, charged with intoxication in a public place, was fined \$20 and costs or 15 days.

Harold James Leslie of Souris Line Road, charged with impaired driving, pleaded guilty and was fined \$100 and costs or 10 days.
