The Telephone Company

Parties using the telephone would find talking much more satisfactory if they observe the following rules:—

1st. Speak with the mouth about four inches from the transmitter.

2nd. Speak in a moderate tone of voice, too loud, and distinctly.

3rd. Place the telephone so as to receive the ear just as if you wished to hear, and not other sounds. Do not press too hard on the ear.

It is possible to talk and to hear at the same time, but it is better to hear than to talk. If you speak too loudly, it is not only unnecessary, and is a waste of wind and lungs, but it is very annoying to all within range of your voice.
