## Brig. W. W. Reid Heads Boy Scouts Of B-P Centenary

Brigadier W. W. Reid was re-elected president of the P. E. I. Provincial Council, Boy Scouts Association during the annual meeting, held last evening at City Hall. The well-attended meeting also elected R. C. Parent as Provincial Commissioner; J. Leslie Doyle as Secretary; Dr. George C. Fisher as treasurer; and E. Gordon Kerr as Executive Commissioner, and featured the presentation of reports by those retiring from the above positions.

The annual report disclosed that 1,334 Islanders are actively engaged in scouting activities throughout the Province. There are 423 boy scouts in 25 scout troops and 783 wolf cubs in 34 wolf cub packs, the remainder of the total including leaders, commissioners, etc.

524 campers attended registered camps for a grand total of 3,479 camper days, and there were, in addition, several short-term troop camps. Three introductory training camps were held during the past year, with courses being given at Alberton, Souris, and Charlottetown. Two preliminary training courses were also presented, one at Summerside Airport and the other at Crapaud Camp.

OTTAWA (CP)—Petty Officer Eugene Hovey of Port Colborne, Ont., is the winner of the navy's second annual photography contest.

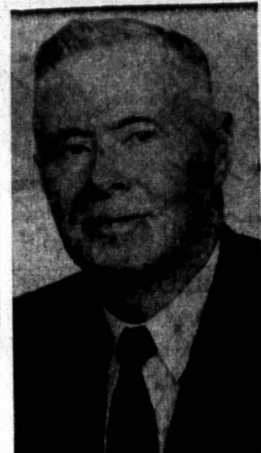
