New Sanitary Code For Dairy Production Planned

WINNIPEG (CP)—A proposed new sanitary code to safeguard the quality of Canada's dairy production is being worked out by the National Dairy Council, President Fred Reynolds of Ottawa said today. The code, setting up suggested minimum sanitary standards for milk plants, cheese factories and processors, would be no elaborate "moo" affair making demands beyond the capacity of the average producer. But Mr. Reynolds hoped that when completed, the code would be adopted by every plant in the country. If there was any delay, "we may find much more stringent and perhaps impractical standards imposed upon us."

Are Not Running For Alberton Council For Various Reasons

Following the announcement by Mayor H. E. Barbour and five members of Alberton Town Council that they would not be up for re-election interviews were held with the Mayor and councillors to learn the reasons behind their decision. Mayor Barbour mentioned pressure of business and stated that he had served as Mayor for four years and previous to that was a member of the Town Council and he thought it was time someone else took over. Commenting on his decision not to re-offer for election, Councillor Nicholson said he was discouraged by the lack of interest shown by citizens in town affairs as evidenced by the fact that only one or two citizens in the last six years has a ratepayer bothered to attend a council meeting.
