

## RHINOS PLAN TO RUN RIVARD

MONTREAL (CP) — The Rhinoceros party, a Montreal group which lampoons Canadian politicians, hopes to run a candidate in the next federal election against Justice Minister Favreau.

His name? Lucien Rivard. Dr. Paul Ferron, the party's founder and chairman, says the Rhinos aren't sure which Lucien Rivard will contest the Montreal - Papineau riding now held by the federal Justice minister.

"The telephone book is full of them," he said in an interview. "In fact, we may try to get a whole bunch of them to run in ridings all over the province."

The one thing that could disrupt party plans, said Dr. Ferron, is the return of the real Lucien Rivard, suspected narcotics - smuggling conspirator who has been on the loose since his escape March 2 from Montreal's Bordeaux Jail.

The Rhinos might have to call off their plan "if the most famous Lucien Rivard of them all happens to show up again before the election," Dr. Ferron said.

The Rhinoceros party adopted its name on grounds that the big animal was a perfect symbol of a politician.

It ran candidates in two federal byelections in the Montreal area in 1963 and drew a total of 388 votes.

## Oceanographer Is Transferred

OTTAWA (CP) — Dr. Arthur E. Collin, 36, head of the Arctic research program at the federal government's Bedford Institute of Oceanography, Dartmouth, N.S., has been transferred to the defence department as staff oceanographer in the meteorology and oceanography section in Ottawa, it was announced here.

Dr. Collin will assist in joint planning, international co-ordination and act as liaison oceanographic matters with the department of mines and technical surveys and other agencies. He will also serve as adviser on developments in oceanography and the training of operational personnel.

He joined the Bedford Institute when it was established in 1962.

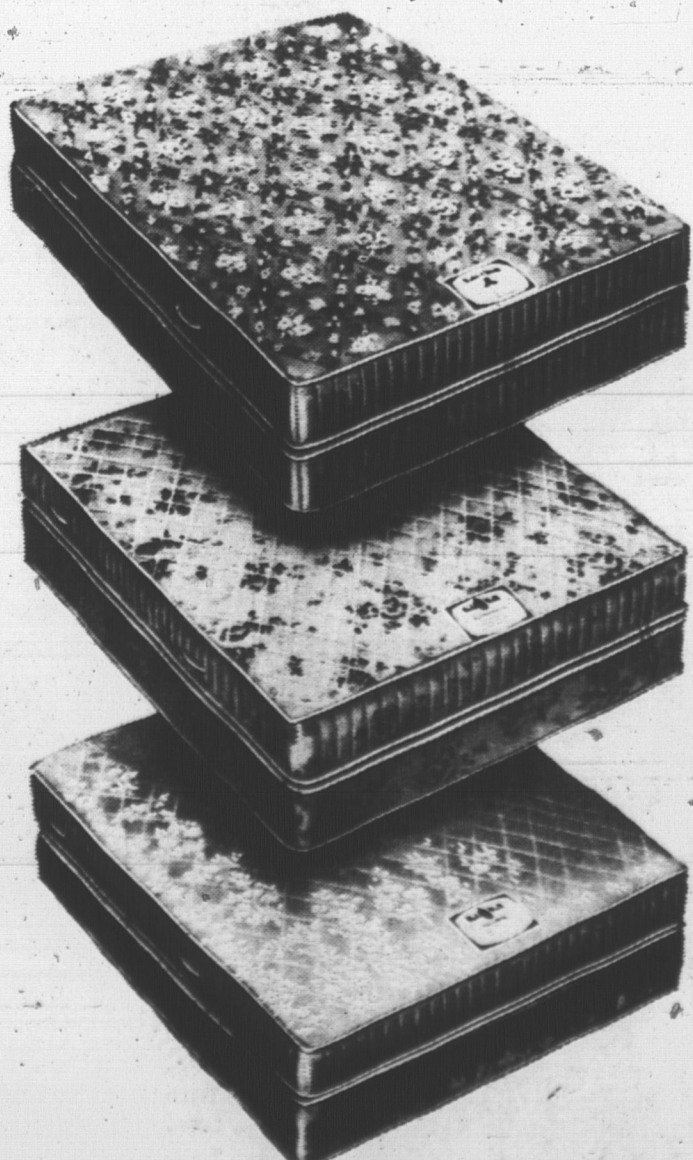
