GERALD RONALD MURPHY
Great was the sorrow in Lot 11 and vicinity when word came that a body removed from the Bow River at Calgary, Alberta, was identified as being that of Craftsman Gerald Ronald Murphy.

Gerald was the eldest son of Mr. and Mrs. Oswald Murphy, (nee Gladys Goff) and was born in Friesland, Lot 11, on April 1st, 1938. Later he moved with his parents to Foxley River, where he attended the district school. After completing Matriculation, Gerald attended St. Dunstan's University for two years.

On April 23rd, 1956, he joined the Canadian Active Army. He served for a time at Kingston, Ontario, being later moved to Calgary, Alberta. At both those parts Gerald had proven to be an exemplary soldier. A message from the Chaplain also showed that he lived according to the teaching of the Catholic Church of which he had always been a faithful member. It was while stationed at Calgary that he met with his untimely death by drowning on April 26th, 1957. The body was discovered on May 31st in the Bow River near St. Georges Island Bridge at 12th St. S.E.
