

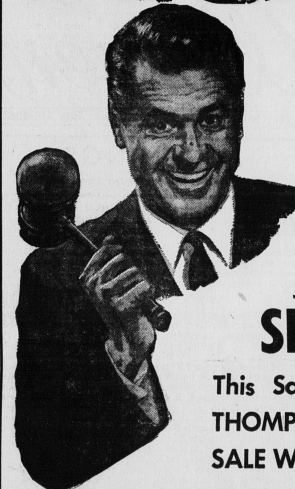

Glenn Gould Cancels Show

Sunday night's performance at Confederation Theatre by world-known Canadian pianist, Glenn Gould, has been cancelled. The artist, plagued by a shoulder injury, wired theatre officials that he would be forced to cancel his engagement, his single performance in Canada this year.

Only last Tuesday artistic director for the Centre, Mavor Moore, received a telegram from Gould's manager stating "Glenn arriving sometime Saturday." But on Thursday he received the following wire from the performer himself. "I have experienced considerable pain and difficulty for the last few days with recurrent shoulder injury which necessitates cancellation of Charlottetown engagement. Sincerely regret, difficult to this will cause you."
