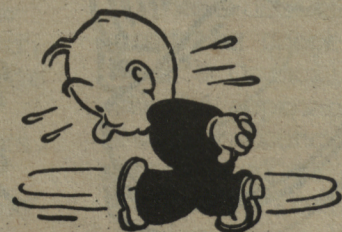
The reception is to be held on Wednesday, March 22, at 6:30 p.m. followed by the Dinner at 7:30.
