was received by Mr. Sifton purporting to be signed by Mr. Philp, asking that the permit be specifically made to include liquor. Mr. Philp says he first heard of the telegram a few days after Mr. Sifton referred to it in the House of Commons, and that he at once communicated with Mr. Sifton, informing him that it was forged. Mr. Sifton, up to the present time, however, has made no retraction of his statement that his late partner, Mr. Philp, had sent the telegram referred to.

Under these circumstances, Sir Charles Tupper naturally apologized to Mr. Philp for having been misled by Mr. Sifton into connecting him personally with the attempts which undoubtedly were made to import liquor into the Yukon under this permit. This, however, in no way affects the charge against Mr. Sifton, viz. that this permit was issued by Mr. Sifton illegally, that attempts were made to use this permit to cover the importation of liquor into the Yukon, as admitted even by Mr. Sifton himself, and that the permit was hawked about for large sums as a valuable franchise in that connection. Much less does Sir Charles Tupper's personal apology to Mr. Philp affect the numerous other most serious charges preferred by Sir Herbert Tupper against Mr. Sifton in connection with his administration of the Yukon, and which Mr. Sifton has not attempted to answer."

Mr. McKenzie and other gentlemen electors who have been misled by the argument that Sir Charles Tupper had exonerated Hon. Mr. Sifton and apologized will, we have doubt, make a note of this correction.

THE CAMPAIGN IN KING'S.

Messrs. A. C. McDonald and Senator Ferguson are holding very successful meetings in King's County. On Thursday evening, these gentlemen addressed a good audience at Cardigan, and last evening they met a fine gathering of farmers of Dundas in the cheese factory of that place.

Both meetings were enthusiastic for Mr. McDonald. The meeting for this evening is to be at Peake's Station, and on Monday evening Senator Ferguson will address the Tupper Club at Georgetown.

At Summersville, Mr. Morson, Q.C., and other Conservative speakers addressed Mr. Hughes' meeting last night. John McLean, Esq., of Souris, and others addressed a meeting in Mr. McDonald's interest at Bay Fortune. All along the line the Conservatives are working with confidence; and the only question seems now to be the size of Mr. McDonald's majority. Mr. Hughes' candidature is not exciting much interest in any part of the county.

The Montreal Gazette remarks that Sir Wilfrid Laurier's indignation at what is called the "forged Globe" is evidently real, and with reason. With those who are not over-acute there would be a danger that the thing would be taken as evidence that the New Liberal Globe had gone back to O.D.L. liberal principles, had become charlatanized in fact.
