Parade Here Commemorates Battle Of Atlantic On Sunday

Naval veterans strengthened by Royal Canadian Legion and RCAF Confederation Wing Members will recall the Battle of the Atlantic by holding church parade Sunday.

The parade is to form in Connaught Square at 10:30 a.m. under the command of Lt. Commander George Vessey, officer commanding Navy League Cadet Corps, Hyndman. Parading also will be Royal Sea Cadet Corps, Kent, under its commanding officer Lt. Harry Thompson. Naval Veterans are to be under the command of Larry Costello.

The parade route is Richmond to Queen to Grafton to Church Street where the Protestant party will break off for service at the Zion Presbyterian Church with the Roman Catholic party carrying on to St. Dunstan's Basilica.

Following the church services the parade will reform in Hillsboro square and proceed south on Richmond Street past the reviewing stand at the Provincial building where Lt. Governor W.J. MacDonald will take the salute. Upon breaking off in Connaught Square, the veterans, the dignitaries and the cadets will be tendered a reception at the Main Base Naval Veterans Association on Richmond Street.

The Battle of the Atlantic Sunday church parade is held annually to commemorate the heroic efforts of the Navy and the Merchant Marine who kept the shipping lanes open during the darkest days of World War II, and to pay tribute to those who made the supreme sacrifice.

Arrangements have been made for a six-week summer school at Prince of Wales College.

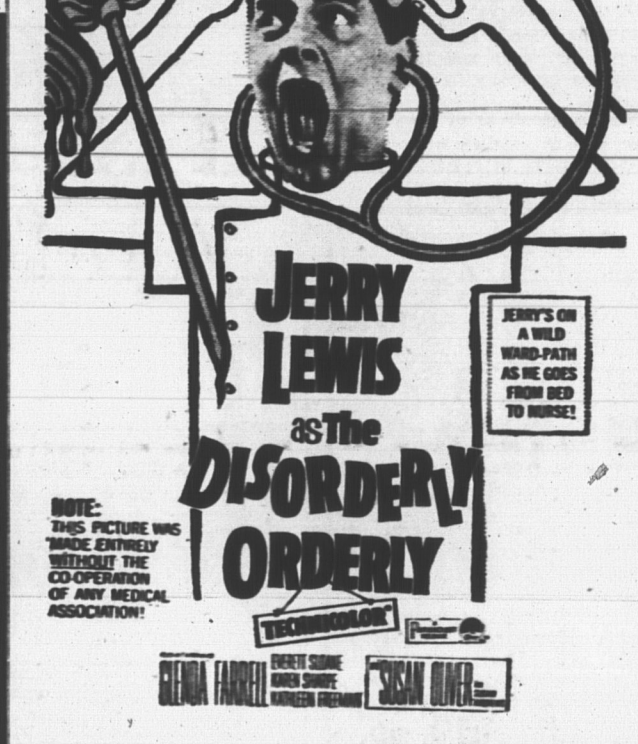
