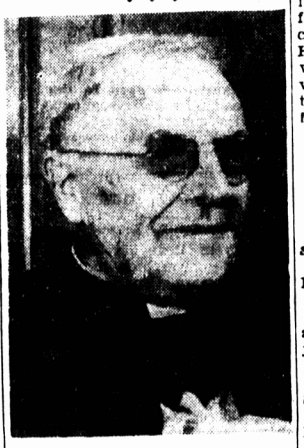
St. Dunstan's --- One Hundred Years

SCIENCE CANNOT LIBERATE WORLD
We hear a lot of talk today about the dignity of man. In democratic countries, one of the ideals is constantly to further and enhance this dignity.

Now to talk of human dignity in the very act of degrading man, is utter nonsense. We talk about how much we are contributing to human greatness, while we are impatiently showing that man is not very great at all. It seems to amount to saying, "We will do more and more for you provided you will admit that you are less and less." The outcome can't help but be that we will soon be doing everything for nothing.

It is very difficult to see how man is gaining anything by this. It's the modern form of a mess of pottage in exchange for the birthright. We make it impossible for a man to be free, and we proclaim that we are liberating him. Liberation from liberty. It makes no sense. It was G. K. Chesterton who maintained that we have bartered the world of common sense for the world of uncommon nonsense.

Man never gets any true honor or dignity from himself. He gets it from God. If we leave God out of man's life, he is always suffering. Christ died for human dignity, and He rose from the dead to prove it. He taught that man came from God and not merely from some amorphous primeval mass. He taught that man must live with God, both here and hereafter. If we take away these truths, man loses his sense of reverence for himself; he becomes heedless of his origin and his destiny, he denies his true nature, and will ultimately destroy all that is good within himself.
