## THE LATEST BOMBARDMENT OF SANTIAGO.

### Position of the Attacking Vessels.

#### HOW THE ATTACK WAS MADE.

[SPECIAL TO THE EXAMINER.]

NEW YORK, June 8.—Particulars of the bombardment of Santiago on Monday last show that the fire of the American ships was very destructive. No American ship was hit and no American was injured. The fleet formed in double column six miles off Morro Castle, and at 6 o'clock in the morning steamed slowly 3,000 yards off shore, the Brooklyn leading, followed by the Marblehead, Texas and Massachusetts, and turned westward.

The second line, the New York leading, with the New Orleans, Yankee, Iowa and Oregon, turned westward. The Vixen and Suwanee were far out on the left flank watching for riflemen on shore. The Dolphin and Porter did similar duty on the right flank.

The line, headed by the New York, attacked the new earthworks near Morro Castle. The Brooklyn column took up a station opposite Strella and Calatua batteries and the new earth works along the shore.

#### THE INVADING ARMY.

## ATLANTIC SERVICE ANOTHER FAILURE.

### Peterson's Can't Come to Time

#### SEVERAL SUPPLEMENTARY CONTRACTS LAPSE.

#### The Government in the Soup Again.

MONTREAL, June 8.—The Star's London cable says the Peterson's have failed to satisfy the Canadian Government as they undertook to do before May 31st on the completion of the underwriting of \$6,250,000 of capital in their company. The failure causes to lapse the supplementary contract by which the government extended the time for building and made other concessions.

#### A Canadian in the Fight.

ST. JOHN, June 8.—Geo F. Phillips, one of the crew of the steamer Merrimac, sunk at Santiago de Cuba harbor, is a son of Mr. Andrew Phillips, of the Intercolonial Freight Department, St. John, and a native of Queen's County, in New Brunswick. He enlisted in the United States Navy in March last giving Boston where his relatives reside as his residence.

#### News Notes.

Captain-General Blanco has issued a decree which orders that no foreign journalist shall be allowed to pass through the Spanish lines. Every foreigner seized in the character of correspondent shall be considered as a spy and judged as such according to the military code.

The Madrid newspapers warn the French press not to indulge in the illusion that Spain will purchase the assistance of France against the United States, by an alliance implying Spain's assent to a cession of Ceuta and Melilla and the development of French preponderance in Morocco.

The Springfield Republican says: "The new Anglo-Canadian-American commission to arrange a settlement of all disputes between Canada and the United States has a difficult task, yet here's good luck to it. The key to our future with England, we repeat, is our future with Canada. The way to have Anglo-American unity is to treat Canada like a brother."

—In the House of Commons a few days ago the Premier gravely announced that the Government had received no notice that West Huron was vacant, though its own action in appointing Mr. Cameron, the sitting member, to an office of emolument, had made an new election in the constituency necessary. It would seem reasonable to infer, says the Montreal Gazette, that the Government does not know what it does. That it does not care what it does has been evident for some time.

## THE PARLIAMENT OF CANADA.

### Supplementary Estimates Passed.

#### THE PLEBISCITE BILL IN SENATE COMMITTEE.

#### Plebiscite Intended to Ascertain the Public Sentiment.

OTTAWA, June 8.—House adjourned at 1.30 this morning, after having passed the supplementary estimates.

Mulock at a late hour gave notice that he will introduce to-day a bill amending the Post Office Act.

Fielding also brought down two supplementary estimates.

In the Senate the Plebiscite Bill is in committee.

In reply to a question, Mr. Mills said the Plebiscite is intended to ascertain if sentiment is strong enough to enforce the law.

The vote might be so small as to be only an evidence of indifference.
