

**U.S.-British  
Row Again  
Over Cuba**

LONDON (AP)—A new U.S.-British dispute developed Tuesday over a report a British steel company was negotiating to sell Cuba heavy cranes powered by American diesel engines.

The Cummins Engine Company of Columbus, Ind., which has supplied a dozen engines in the last year to Britain's Steel and Company, promptly announced it will cut off its engine supplies to the British firm.

The negotiations were reported by The Daily Mail, which said a contract of \$300,000 (\$1,500,000) could be involved if the Cubans buy the cranes from Steel and Company.

The report brought British and American authorities into immediate conflict, as have past deals to sell buses and other British goods to Premier Fidel Castro's government.

A spokesman at the U.S. Embassy said the deal would be "a contravention of U.S. treasury and export regulations." But a spokesman for Britain's Board of Trade said "who could call a crane a strategic weapon?"

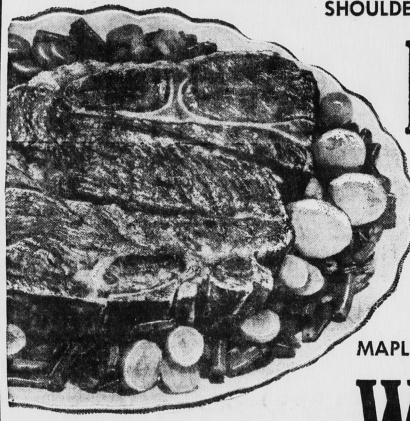

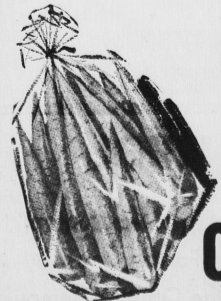
