

### Los Angeles TV Repairman Admits To Three Murders

LOS ANGELES (AP) — A mousey, jug-eared television repairman Friday led detectives to the desert graves of two of three women he admits murdering. Earlier, Harvey M. Glatman, 30, told how he strangled and raped the women—two of them South—then used the desolate models—then California desert for his graveyard. Glatman took police to a remote, sandy area east of San Diego and there—four miles apart—pointed out two shallow graves. In them were the decomposed bodies of two women he identified as Mrs. Shirley Ann Bridgford and Ruth Rita Mercado. A body found in the adjoining county of Riverside last December is believed to be that of his third victim, Mrs. Judy Ann Dull, 19, of West Hollywood. Glatman was arrested Monday when a fourth intended victim fought him off and held him at bay with his own gun until police arrived. In all three murders, Glatman used the same technique, police said. He would first contact his victim by telephone, make a date—to take pictures in the case of the two models—rape them and kill them with the same piece of sash cord. Glatman told how he killed: "I would make them kneel down. With the gun on them, I would tie this five-foot piece of rope around their ankles. Then I would loop it around their neck. Then I would stand there and keep pulling until they quit struggling."
