A highway accident at West Devon Sunday morning resulted in serious injuries to Euclid DesRoches of Miscouche and less serious injuries to Douglas Blanchard of Summerside.

A 1959 Dodge pick-up truck, said to have been driven by Blanchard, struck the right guard rail at MacNeill's Bridge, skidded along the rail snapping off two

posts, crossed the highway and turned end over end in the ditch. Following treatment at the scene by Dr. George Dewar of O'Leary the two men were rushed to Prince County Hospital at Summerside.

DesRoches is suffering a badly cut forehead, fractured skull, concussion and a fractured shoulder. Blanchard has a deep cut on the forehead. The truck was extensively damaged.

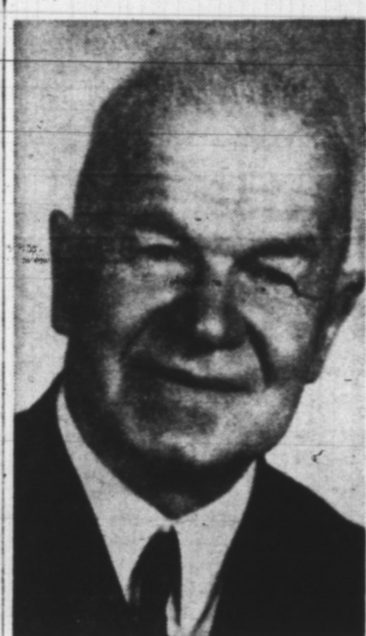

FRATERNITY SUSPENDED

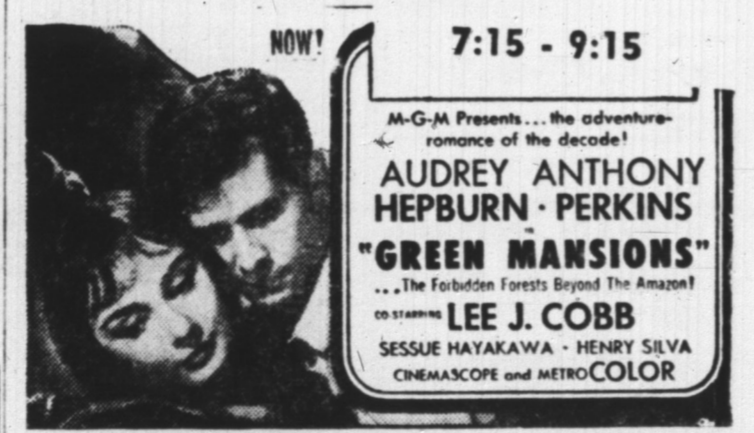

Four Island Jersey cows have attained R.O.P. records during the month of July according to the August issue of the Canadian Jersey Breeder. All records reported are on a 305 day basis.

In the mature class, "Hedgelee Alma," an 11-year-old, owned by Clark Bros, New Wiltshire, produced 11,369 pounds of milk, 599 pounds of butter testing 5.27 per cent.

In the four year senior class "Hedgelee Jester Holly," produced 8,441 pounds of milk, 566 pounds of butterfat testing 6.71 per cent.

"Hedgelee Jester Hope" produced 7,257 pounds of milk, 481 pounds of butterfat testing 6.63 per cent.
