Of Special Interest to our Farmers

The Proposed Illustration Stations.

The last number of the Co-operative Farmer says: We hear that it is proposed by the Dominion Minister of Agriculture to ask Parliament for an appropriation to establish fifty stations where the practical truths learned through the Experimental Farm system may be demonstrated at various points throughout the Dominion. In a fair allotment of these stations the Maritime Provinces should have from twelve to fourteen. We have not learned the full particulars of the scheme, but we believe the intention will be to make an arrangement with a farmer whose land is centrally located and available for public inspection to use the seeds and manures supplied and to cultivate his land according to directions, the increase of his crops and a small fee to remunerate him for his extra trouble and book-keeping. We also presume that inspectors will be appointed who will have charge of a number of these farms and who will be immediately responsible for carrying on the work and its success or failure. If the right men can be secured for inspectors and good locations got, we believe the scheme to be excellent and we should hope to see a great many more than fifty such stations in operation in a few years. It is the practical demonstration in each neighborhood which makes the strongest appeal to the farmers within reach, and we believe these illustrations can be made not only a great educational factor in themselves, but also that they will lead to further enquiry and research and instill in the young farmers a longing for more agricultural knowledge. When this desire is once sufficiently stimulated, the future of our Canadian agriculture will be assured.

We can see a good many difficulties in the way of the practical working of these stations, but we have faith that what Prof. J. W. Robertson undertakes he will carry out successfully, and if he once embarks upon this scheme our readers can rest assured it will have a large measure of success. It is to be hoped that party politics will not enter into its working, as for scientific purposes political partisanship is generally a great hindrance.

Good Prices for Eggs.

Mr. E. L. Robertson who is doing a pork packing business at Amherst, N. S. informs the editor of the Farmer that he has an excellent demand for pork and pork products, but has found it very difficult for the last six weeks to get such pigs as are profitable to cut up. He wants pigs well fleshed, dressing from 150 to 200 lbs. and can pay for them at present date from 6 to 6 1/2 cents per lb. The pigs such as some people put on the market, he cannot make profitable at 4 cents per pound.—Co-operative Farmer.

Milk Straines Among Hogs.

Too little attention has been paid by breeders and farmers to the milking qualities of their brood sows, and yet of all things to be taken into consideration in selecting brood sows this characteristic is the most important. the kindest, most careful mother, is always the one that gives the biggest flow of milk and the sow that gives frequently, and she most gladly responds to the call of the little fellows for a lunch as often as they want it. She is careful and grateful to them for the relief they give her. The other sow finds no such comfort from her litter, since she has no need for that kind of relief; on the contrary, the frequent demands of the half-starved pigs are unpleasant to her. She becomes irritable and cross at their persistent calls for more. She would rather be left alone, go off by herself, eat her fill and lie down undisturbed while she converts it into pork on her own back instead of her pigs. Consequently, at the weaning time, you will find her in pretty good shape, while the pigs are all runts. But the other sow and her litter, how do they look? Just the reverse.—American Swineherd.

Valancy Fuller, the well known Jersey breeder, in an address before a dairy convention in Maine, gives the following excellent advice: "Let me urge every dairy farmer to study his cows closely; learn their individualities and their needs; supply such needs tempered by judgment; seek by careful selection and coupling, and by skilful handling and feeding to make the daughter better than the mother; be as true to your cows as they have been to you, and they will prove not only a pleasure but the most profitable bank account you can have, a worthy heritage to be handed down to your sons and daughters.

Some succulent food should be given to breeding ewes at all times, though it is very easy to feed them too much just previous to lambing. When turnips or silage are fed to breeding ewes in too liberal quantities, weak lambs are likely to result. Before lambing 3 lbs of any succulent food such as mangels, sugar beets, turnips or carrots will be found sufficient. After lambing unlimited quantities may be fed to stimulate the milk flow.—Exchange.
