Charlottetown is the capital of Prince Edward Island and birthplace of Canadian Confederation. Charlottetown is a beautiful tree-lined city located on a fine land-locked harbor, at the confluence of the East, York and West Rivers. It is an historic old city and was designated the provincial capital in the year 1764. The English named it in honor of Queen Charlotte, consort of King George III of England. The present population is 18,300, but the city is compact, most of the interesting places to visit can be reached within easy walking distances. However, it is recommended that the visitor motor to the waterfront and beautiful Victoria Park and enjoy a pleasant and leisurely ride while seeing some of the outlying places of interest.

The Provincial Building on Charlottetown's Queen Square is the most interesting in the whole of Canada. It was in this building in 1864 that the Fathers of Confederation met for the first time. As a result the birth of a nation took place in this building in the room now known and preserved as the Confederation Chamber. It is visited yearly by thousands of people from every section of North America and other parts of the world.

**OPEN DAILY**

The original chairs and the table round which the founding fathers sat are still there as well as many mementoes of the early history of Prince Edward Island. The Chamber is open daily except Sunday and visitors are always welcome. There is no charge for admission and a uniformed Commissemnaire is constantly on duty to conduct group or personal tours.  This year could provide a major breakthrough in the tourist industry of the province, according to Mr. Stewart. He said "with the hundreds of thousands of visitors expected, this is the time to impress on them the virtues of the province as a tourist resort. The impressions these visitors receive this year of our province and its tourist potentialities can have a terrific effect for years to come."

**GREAT MANY CAMPERS**  
 While a great many visitors to the province have already reserved accommodations in hotels, motels and guest homes, the parks division of the department of tourist development has prepared for occupation this summer 25 camp sites and trailer grounds.

"A great many visitors," said Mr. Stewart, "will be campers. In the provincial campgrounds, we are now able to offer accommodation on a par with the best in Canada. Camp grounds have been provided with water and power facilities and most of the sites show the province's best scenery to advantage."

"In addition, there has been an expansion in the permanent type of accommodation and the expansion of provincial parks is going on all the time."

**BIG FACTORS**  
 Transportation, which through the years has appeared to be a sore point with Islanders, has been improved to such an extent that it will be a big factor in the tourist industry this year.

"The MV Prince Nova on the Wood Island Ferry service," said Mr. Stewart, "is a most welcome addition. The provincial highway system is being improved, particularly by the construction of a 1-1 weather roads, and when the new dock facilities are completed at Borden, this will help the tourist industry a great deal."

In conclusion, Mr. Stewart emphasized that a "Centennial Year can prove a great breakthrough in the tourist industry for the province." He said "our thousands of visitors can become our goodwill ambassadors. If they like what they see and how they are treated, they will tell others and our best advertisement is a satisfied tourist."
