**Winnipeg Firm Has Device To Monitor Baby Heartbeat**

WINNIPEG (CP) — A Winnipeg firm has developed a small but accurate device to measure the heartbeat of an unborn baby. The device is one of a family of four medical instruments developed by Hargrave Applied Research Corp. Ltd. The simple design of the monitor resulted from the belief of Settler that "present medical equipment is too sophisticated, too complicated, too big." The 2½-pound foetal heart monitor has three sensitive transducers which are attached to the expectant mother's abdomen. The transducers change the vibration of the heartbeat into an electrical impulse. The foetal heartbeat—a doctor's only communication with an unborn child—can be monitored constantly for irregularities during pregnancy and childbirth. A significant change in rate of heartbeat is a danger signal. The heartbeat can be either graphed or monitored by ear at a nurse's station or in the delivery room.

**HEARS FAINT BEAT**

Though the monitor is generally used during late pregnancy or childbirth, it can register the heartbeat of the foetus when it is 20 weeks old.

Other monitors developed by the company include a pulse monitor, blood pressure monitor and combination pulse and blood monitor.

All are run on rechargeable batteries and weigh no more than four pounds. They are small enough to fit into the glove compartment of a car and cost is within easy reach of any hospital.

**Tremendous Craters Seen In Moon Shots**

PASADENA, Calif. (AP) — Russia's 25 new photographs of the back of the moon show a tremendous number of craters, ranging from two to 20 miles in diameter, a Soviet scientist said here.

Also, said Dr. B. Y. Levin, there are great chains of craters, an arrangement not seen on the side visible from earth. One crater chain is 600 miles long, he said.

Dr. Levin, of the Schmidt Institute of Earth Physics, Moscow, described the photos on the sixth and final day of a California Institute of Technology - Jet Propulsion Laboratory planetary conference.

Russia's spacecraft Zond 3 took the photos July 18 at a distance of 5,000 to 7,000 miles in a 68-minute fly-by behind the moon.

In 1959 the Russians photo-

graphed part of the back of the moon without obtaining much detail.

The new pictures leave only a small percentage of the lunar surface unknown, Dr. Levin said, adding: "The back side of the moon is no longer an enigma."

He said the photos show several depressions — big, flat areas, darker than the rest of the lunar surface — some with rays of lighter-colored material radiating outward.

**MRS. ANDREW JOHNSTONE**  
The death of Mrs. Andrew Johnstone occurred at her home in Kensington on August 25, 1965. For many years around there was a general feeling that a near and dear friend had passed away, of sterling character possessing those qualities of mind and heart which made her respected and loved, she was of a cheerful and genial temperament making many warm friends among young and old. "Her life was an inspiration her memory is a benediction." Almost an centenarian her death deserves more than a passing notice. Born at Greenvale, P.E.I., December 31, 1867 the daughter of William Brown and his wife Elizabeth Clark, they moved to Margate while she was quite young.

She was the first secretary of the Women's Missionary Society in Margate Church, retaining her interest in church. After she married Andrew Johnstone, Long River, in 1890, she became a member of the Presbyterian Church and a Life member of the W.M.S. and later the U.C.W. She was very active in the Women's Institute and other community activities where she lived for over 71 years.

In 1902 when she was left a widow with five small children and a large farm and again when her son Arthur was killed in action in July, 1917, the strength of her Christian character was very evident.

Her keen and alert mental capacities led her to enter the "Centennial Essay Competition" at the age of 96 years when she reviewed the life in Margate as a business centre, when Kensington was known as Barrett's Cross with only a few houses, also remembering when the first train passed through Kensington. She saw farming develop from the scythe and flail to the present day self-propelled combine.

This remarkable lady was ever busy with her hands, entering cut-work and knitting at the Canadian National Exhibition, Toronto, at 95 years and obtaining "honorable mention".

Coming to live with her son, William E. and his wife in Kensington in 1961, she adjusted well to her new surroundings making many new friends. Her interest in people, her love of music and flowers all added to her zest for life.

The funeral which was held from Kensington United Church was largely attended and was conducted by her minister Rev. W.A. Paterson, assisted by Rev. Alex MacKay an old friend, and her nephew Rev. Harold Brown, Ottawa.

Interment took place in the family plot at the Geddie Memorial Cemetery.
