

IN MEMORIAM

MRS. PETER T. POWER

The death took place on May 10 at the City Hospital, of Mrs. Peter T. Power of Mount Edward Road at the age of sixty-four years. Although she had been sick for some time, yet her death came as a shock to her many friends, many of whom did not realize that she was so ill.

Born in Ugg, Vernon River Parish, the daughter of Neil MacPherson and Elizabeth McKean, she spent her early years in her native district and attended the district school. As a young woman she worked for some time in Charlottetown and then moved to St. Margaret's where she married Peter T. Power. After some years her husband a C. N. R. Station Master, was transferred to St. Peter's Bay where they lived for some fifteen years. Transfers to Murray Harbour, Freeport and Kensington followed, the longest stay being at the latter where they resided for some years until on her husband's retirement from the C. N. R. Service five years ago. They then moved to Charlottetown where they resided ever since.

Mrs. Power's christian character and sterling qualities endeared her to a wide circle of friends and acquaintances in the many communities in which she lived, and even with the passing of years, these ties seemed to become stronger which was more forcibly brought to mind by the many tributes and letters of condolence which were received by her family. A devoted member of the Catholic Church, Mrs. Power was always active in parish organizations. In each and every parish in which she lived, by her unselfishness of life, high character and noble ideals she truly was a living example of what a devoted follower of Our Divine Lord should be. And when her last hour came to die, fortified by the rites of the Church, she passed to her eternal reward with Christian piety and filial resignation.

Besides her sorrowing husband, she leaves to mourn her daughter, Mary Mrs. Everett Jay of Charlottetown, and one grandchild, of whom she was so fond, Everett Jay Sr., one son-in-law, Everett Jay Jr., and the following brothers and sisters: Reverend K. G. MacPherson, Tracadie, P. E. I.; Mrs. Thomas McMillan, Charlottetown; Joseph of Great Falls, Montana; Joseph of Portland, Oregon; and Roderick of Glendale, California.

The funeral was held on May the fifth from St. Dunstan's Basilica where Solemn High Mass was celebrated by her brother, Reverend K. C. MacPherson, with her nephew, Reverend Kenneth McMillan as Deacon, and Reverend Walter McQuigan as Sub-deacon. The services at the grave were conducted by Reverend Kenneth C.
