WHEREAS the General Assembly of this Island stands prorogued to Tuesday the fourth Day of June, Instant,

I have therefore thought fit, by and with the Advice of his Majesty's Council, further to prorogue the said GENERAL ASSEMBLY, and the same is hereby prorogued to Tuesday the fifth Day of November next, then to meet at Charlotte Town for the Dispatch of Public Business; of which all Persons concerned are required to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly.

Given under my Hand and Seal at Arms, at the Council Chamber, in Charlotte Town, in the Island aforesaid, this first Day of June, in the Year of our Lord, One Thousand seven Hundred and Ninety-three, and in thirty-third Year of his Majesty's Reign.

CURIOUS PROPHECY.

The following Prophecy of Dr. George Brown Archbishop of Dublin, written in 1558, is extracted from the Annals of Ireland by Sir James Ware.

THERE will start up a monstrous fraternity in a great empire, which will seduce numbers who live mostly as Scribes and Pharisees. These men will endeavour to abolish even truth itself, and will nearly effect it. They will put on every form and shape in order to deceive mankind: With Pagans they will be Pagans, Atheists with Atheists, Jews with Jews, Reformers with Reformers, and this in order to find out the intentions, the designs, the manners, the inclinations, of all, and to engage them in the end to become as the fool who said in his heart, "There is no God in Heaven, and therefore there should be no law to govern mankind on the earth." They will do every thing to annihilate the power of Princes, under a false pretext of labouring after liberty, and for a happiness which the people cannot taste of, because they have abandoned the laws of God, despised his worship, driven away its faithful ministers, &c. Liberty the people will lose in the end, without perceiving it has slipped through their hands. All this will be inflicted on them as a punishment for having lent their hands to the destruction of their lawful Sovereign, born to be their support on earth, as God is their support in Heaven. Nevertheless, God, in the end, for the justification of his law, will cut off this Society from the face of the earth, by the hands even of those who were its greatest supporters, and who had the most advanced themselves by its hellish means. It will become odious to all nations upon earth; its members will be persecuted every where. They will be reduced, in the end, to a worse condition than the Jews; they will not find a place in the earth whereon to lay their heads. A Jew and a Savage will even find more favour than they.

CURE FOR THE SCURVY.

A Correspondent who has known the following simple receipt to cure the most obstinate SCURVY, is desirous of communicating it to the public, for the benefit of those who may be afflicted with that dreadful complaint.

Put an equal quantity of cream of tartar and flour of sulphur into a vessel, and then pour in boiling water; keep it covered for one night. The patient, if an adult, must drink half a pint every morning fasting, and, if not disagreeable, the same quantity at night when going to bed. Though the patient were almost a leper, our correspondent pledges himself, a few weeks observance will effect a cure. A quarter of a pound of cream of tartar and the same quantity of sulphur, will be sufficient for two gallons of water.
