**Creation Explained To Club**

SUMMERSIDE — "Municipal affairs as they are applicable to the town of Summerside" was the topic of guest speaker, J.A. Brophy, town manager at Wednesday's annual meeting of a banquet of Summerside C.W.L. The meeting, held in the Acadia Centre, Water Street, was chaired by president, Mrs. Levi Gallant.

Head table guests were Mr. and Mrs. Brophy; Mrs. Fred Gaudet, first vice president; Mrs. Wilfred Perry, second vice president; Mrs. Malcolm Steele, recording secretary; Mrs. George Olscamp, past president; Mrs. Cecil Clow, treasurer; Mrs. Clifford Gallant, third vice president; Mrs. Ben Arsenault, press secretary; Rev. J.E. O'Hanley, Minister. Mr. Brophy, introduced by Miss Margaret Wedge, commended the women for their "fine charitable works of endeavor."

**USED CHART**

To illustrate his topic, Mr. Brophy used a flip-chart. He made to explain such matters as population, taxes, revenue and expenditures. "In 1971 Summerside had a population of 911," he stated. "Today the figure stands at 8612. With this increase in number of people there has also been an increase in the need for public services; and with this comes taxation."

The town manager stated that sewers, water and fire protection services were first included in the tax budget in 1907. He noted that in 1947 Summerside had \$85,000 in capital value in public schools. Today the figure stands at \$93,000. Mr. Brophy pointed out that schools are operated by the school trustees.

**TOWN REVENUE**

The guest speaker explained by means of his chart how the town gets and spends money. It was noted that 65.6 per cent of the total revenue in Summerside comes from taxation. Mr. Brophy also explained that when there is a surplus, the extra money goes into the new budget for the following year, and is not "banked" or taken out of circulation, contrary to some opinions.

The chart also indicated how bonds are bought and sold in the town and the uses made of the money.

Mr. Brophy said if Summerside does not expand from its present size, the bonds would be paid off by 1977.
