Throughout the night a vigil was maintained by members of the Morell fire department at the scene of the tragedy, near a Stokely Farm, St. Peter's harbor, five miles west of Morell.

The tragedy claimed the lives of Mrs. Charles Wayne, 46, Toronto, and three children of Mr. and Mrs. James Lloyd of West Rouge, a Toronto suburb, Philip 6, and four-year-old twins 1 and 2, Terrence and Michelle Anita.

The remains of the four victims are resting at the MacLean Funeral Home, until noon Sunday, when they will be transferred to the United Church, St. Peter's Bay, for a massed funeral commencing at 2 p.m. interment will be Midgell cemetery.

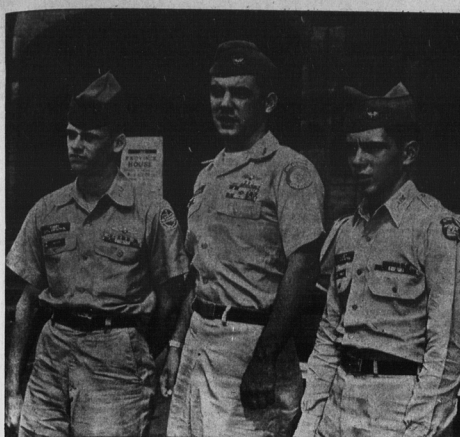
