19-Gun Salute, Not 21 Slated For Khrushchev

By LEWIS GULICK WASHINGTON (AP) — Nikita S. Khrushchev may be the big boss in Russia, but as premier he's only the head of government, not chief of state.

As a result of this distinction, Washington officialdom is putting together something less than the most to greet the Soviet premier when he arrives Sept. 15.

Khrushchev will step onto a red carpet after his Russian jetliner alights at Washington National Airport. But the trimmings won't be as fancy as they would be if he were king Nikita or president Khrushchev.

The ceremonial troops at the airport will fire off mere 19-gun salute, not a 21-rounder.

WHITE HOUSE MEETING President Eisenhower can meet Khrushchev at the White House instead of journeying out to the airport to greet him.

Khrushchev will get a free ride in a motorcade to the president's guest house, but not an official ceremonial procession.

The protocol distinction which sets Khrushchev below the chief of state level does not detract from the real importance attached to his visit here.

The same line has been drawn ceremonially from Britain's Harold Macmillan, India's Pandit Nehru, and West Germany's Konrad Adenauer, none of whom is a head of state although all are tops in government importance.

The U.S.S.R.'s chief of state is Khrushchev will address the UN General Assembly Sept. 18, then leave for the west coast.

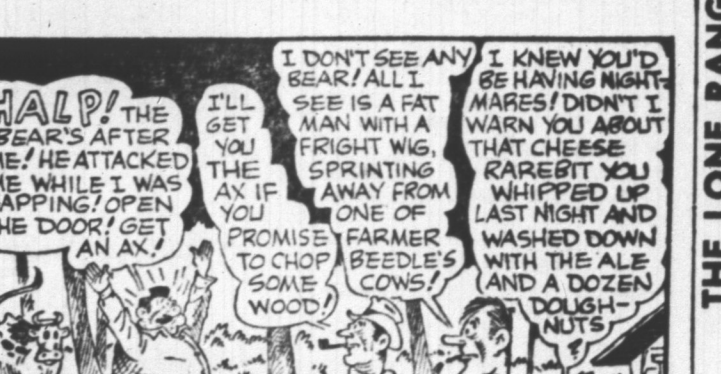

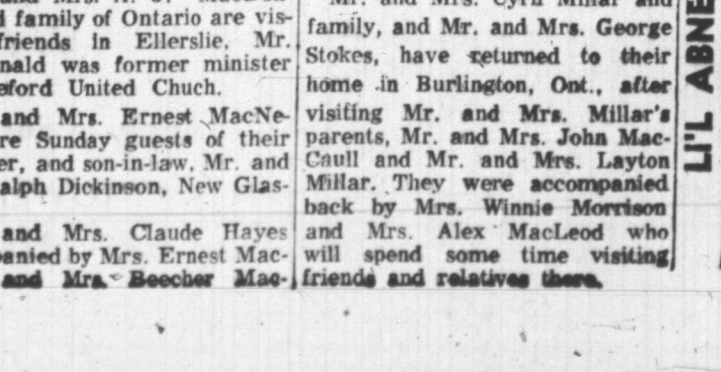

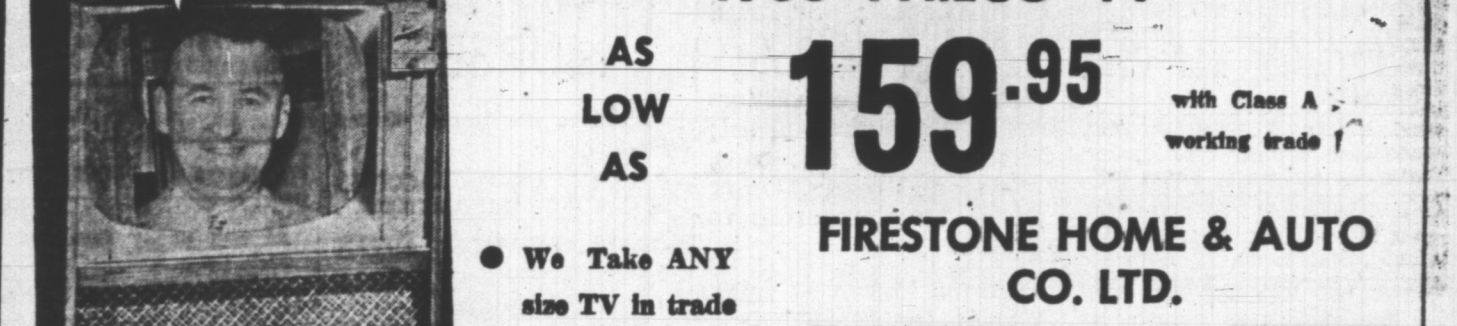
