  - 43 years old
  - Justice of the B.C. Supreme Court
  - Commissioner in the MacKenzie Valley Pipeline Inquiry
  - has been described as an intense, serious man
  - has been in federal and provincial politics
  - is a fighter for native rights and aboriginal land claims
2. Morley Callaghan
  - author
  - good speaker
  - educated at St. Michael's U. of T. and Osgoode Hall
  - worked at Toronto Star with Hemmingway who encouraged him to write
  - in his seventies
3. Edgar Gallant
  - born in Egmont Bay, in 1924--53 years old
  - Chairman, National Capital Commission since 1973
  - sec'y to Council of Ma. Pre. 1971-73
  - served Federal Treasury Board 1949-64
  - serves on the NATO International Secretarial in Paris and Canada's mission to the

EEC in Brussels

4. Peter Newman
  - born in 1929 in Vienna
  - 48 years old
  - educated in Ontario
  - he is editor of Maclean's since 1971, founded its rebirth as a nationalistic magazine
  - founded Committee for An Independent Canada
  - wrote several TV series for CBC
  - written several books including the Canadian Establishment, a comprehensive socio-economic study
5. Gordon Sinclair
  - born in Toronto in 1900
  - 1923-36 established a reputation as a cocky roving correspondent and travel-writer for Toronto Star
  - Became radio broadcaster in 1943 in Toronto and soon had the largest following of any broadcaster in T. O. because he was so opinionated.
  - started on F.P.C. in 1957
  - has written two volumes of memoirs
6. Patrick Watson
  - 47 years old
  - Co-hosted and co-produced this Hour Has Seven Days and has hosted several since then both in Canada and the U.S., and also has acted.
  - has written books on

a wide range of subjects such as art, media, politics, education, and novels
