PRIZES SEIZED ON 'BANKRUPT'

SHEFFIELD, England (AP) Alan Welton was piling up prizes on the television quiz show Concentration.

First a tape recorder, then an electric cooker, a motor scooter and a water softener. Some fountain pens, clothing and two parakeets followed in quick succession.

Among the millions of viewers was a man who found something familiar about Welton's rugged face and cultured voice.

The viewer was Kenneth Miller, official receiver for Sheffield. Before Welton completed his prize-winning game, Miller had recognized Welton as an undischarged bankrupt.

Miller telephoned the Granada television network to hang on to the prizes. All but the fountain pen, the clothing and the parakeets were impounded. "The rest will be sold and the proceeds distributed among Welton's creditors," said Miller.

Weather Cuts Fire Damages

OTTAWA (CP) — Favorable weather conditions were mainly responsible for a big reduction in the number and extent of forest fires this year, compared with 1958, the resources department reported Saturday.

Figures showed there were 5,337 forest fires this year, down by 33 per cent from a total of 7,817 fires a year ago. Acreage destroyed or burned over totalled 704,500 acres, down from 4,939,000 in 1958.

The department said increased forest fire protection facilities and quick action by firefighters made substantial contributions to the improved situation.

Survivors Of Disaster Give Thanks For Safety

FREJUS, France (Reuters)—Survivors of the Frejus flood disaster Sunday attended an open-air mass to give thanks for their deliverance from sudden death Wednesday night.

Thousands knelt in brilliant sunshine before an improvised altar—a simple table covered by a sheet set up on the ruins of the railway station—as the bishop of Frejus celebrated the mass.

The words of Msgr. Henri Mazerat often were drowned out by the sound of helicopters carrying relief work and bulldozers clearing away piles of wreckage.

An interior ministry announcement in Paris Sunday night said 323 bodies have been recovered in the flood area with 256 of

them identified. Some bodies were washed up along Riviera beaches as far as Nice, 45 miles away.

The task of identifying the bodies went on as corpses were sealed into coffins as a prevention against epidemic.

Each victim has been photographed and the coffins bear cards with such descriptions as: "Little girl about four with blonde hair wearing a blue dress."

"Old woman about 65, three gold teeth in upper jaw."

The staff of the local hospital was vaccinated Sunday against typhoid and today the entire population will begin to receive compulsory free vaccination.

Ike, Nehru To Discuss Red Threat

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Eisenhower will get a firsthand report from Prime Minister Nehru this week on the extent of the threat posed by Red China to India's non-Communist neighbors.

What he learns may have a vital bearing on the prospects for starting a world-wide disarmament system during Eisenhower's last year in office.

As Communist China's hostility increases, there is increasing concern in official quarters here over the possibility of setting up an effective inspection system to police any kind of disarmament accord—even a relatively simple undertaking to refrain from testing nuclear weapons.

Every major Western plan for disarmament, as well as the nuclear test ban treaty now under negotiation at Geneva, provides for the establishment of inspection stations manned by international teams in China as well as the Soviet Union.

COULD FORCE ARMAMENT
New aggression by Chinese forces in disputed border areas could force Nehru into an armament program he long has avoided. The cost of this could cut into India's economic plan—unless the burden was offset by more outside aid.

Eisenhower made a new appeal for disarmament before leaving on his goodwill tour Thursday night. But he said the first requirement for a disarmament agreement with the Communist bloc is provision for a mutually effective controls system.

State Secretary Christian Herter told a press conference Nov. 24 that it is "very much of a question" whether any kind of a disarmament agreement would be practical without China's participation.

But the fact is that of about 180 inspection stations which would be necessary to police the nuclear test ban being negotiated at Geneva, approximately eight would have to be set up in China. There would be about 12 on U.S. territory and 20 to 24 on Soviet territory.

Sea, Shell Fish Show Increase
OTTAWA (CP) — The Canadian catch of sea fish and shell fish in the first 10 months of this year increased from the same period a year ago but total value went down by \$10,320,000.
