

# Millionaires Defeat Glac Bay Miners 4-2 In Wide-Open Contest

SYDNEY, Dec. 26—(CP)—Sydney Millionaires continued their mastery over last-place Glac Bay Miners with a 4-2 victory to night in a Maritime Major Hockey League game before 1,463 fans.

Although a wide-open contest, there were only two penalties and the holiday crowd left pleased with the performance.

Miners made a thrilling bid in the third period and only the spectacular goaltending of Nick Pidsodny kept them from downing Johnny Horeck's second-place club. It was Horeck's first win since he took over Monday.

Eddie Marneau and Dunc MacIntyre, playing defence, led the Sydney attack. Marneau, easily the outstanding player on the ice, scored two goals and an assist while MacIntyre assisted on three, including the play which put Lorne Pirie in the clear for the winning goal.

Miners' Don Keller started the scoring early in the first, which was followed by Marneau's two goals within 30 seconds which gave Sydney a lead they never surrendered.

His goals came while Neil Amadio, who assist on Keller's tally with Gordie Miller, was sitting out an interference penalty. The Millionaires' peanut line tallied the others.

Midway through the second, MacIntyre put Lorne Pirie in the clear for what proved to be the winning marker. Lockhart didn't have a chance on the blazing drive.

Lockhart, outshot 16-8 in the first, had it easier in the second period. His forwards peppered Pirie with 12 shots while he handled two less. But Miners, apparently over-anxious were inaccurate, and the legdemain of Pidsodny spoiled the others.

Hub Macey, who streaked goal-ward after a perfect pass from Backor, rifled in Glac Bay's second.

## Big Plans Underway For 1953 Racing Season At Summerside Track

The shades lights, wire and bulbs have already arrived and holes have been dug for the poles and it is hoped that by mid June the ball will be rolling smoothly. Weekly races will be held and a starting gate used to insure good quick starts.

A green Christmas, our first in many years, was our lot in 1952. To many of us Christmas is complete without a blanket of clean white snow and the jingle of sleigh bells. I'll admit a snow covered countryside, especially if the trees are laden with its white burden, lends a Christmasy touch that nothing else can replace.

While we humans may have grumbled a bit at the sea of mud and drab mist laden sky that greeted us on Christmas morning, it meant full stomachs for the birds and animals that constitute our wildlife.

Just two animals, to my knowledge, would stand to gain by a foot or more of snow—the rabbits and field mice. The rabbits are too conspicuous in their snow white coats and many eyes spot them as they hop along the runways amid the green spruce swamps. Mice too have no extra covering for their runways and nests and a fox can pin point mouse in grass, no difference how thick and matted, in nothing flat. Oh well, I think Nature intended mice and rabbits to be a meal ticket or staple diet for all forms of winged and four footed predators... so what are we worrying over?

# Atlantics Increase Lead With 5-2 Win Over Islanders Last Night

There's a law of averages that's as old as tradition but the Halifax Atlantics are on their way to breaking that law unless there's a transformation in form by the Islanders hockey team shortly.

The win-happy Atlantics racked up their twelfth win of the season over the Islanders last night by downing the home town club 5-2 at the Forum in a not-too-well played game before 2,500 fans.

The Atlantics, backed by a solid defense and forwards who played their positions with eternal vigilance, took quick advantage of breaks they engineered or which came their way to defeat the hapless Islanders.

The Haligonians, using only two complete forward lines, shot the only goal of the first period and were never headed. The Islanders tied it up in the middle frame but the Atlantics were ahead 3-1. Sloppy defensive work cost the Islanders three of their goals. One of the other two goals was a desperation shot at the Islanders cage and the final marker came in the dying seconds as the Islanders played without goalie Al Millar in favor of the extra forwards.

Left winger Walter Pawlyshyn scored both of the Islanders goals. His first was a low shot from deep in the corner of the Halifax zone and his second resulted from a ripping 25-foot slap shot that goalie Roy McMeekin partly stopped.

MacMeekin, although given excellent support by his defense which held, hooked and checked hard, played a good game in the Halifax cage. He turned aside 29 shots and among them were about half a dozen goal-laden drives.

As a result of their win the Atlantics move fourteen points out in front of the third place Islanders. The latter are in third place two points behind the Sydney Millionaires.

Youthful Kenny Laufman of the Atlantics put the Atlantics ahead at the 15:35 minute mark of the first period with a goal that was of the unearned variety. Laufman picked up a pass at centre-ice and caught the Islanders defense out of position. He was partially blocked but managed to get one arm clear and shove the puck into the ice in the corner of the net.

Walter Pawlyshyn and Gary Gooden of the Islanders, Billy Gool and Muckle Hollett of the Atlantics had the best scoring opportunities of the period. Al Millar blocked both Halifax tries while the first of snow with a ball and chain on him. Some of their masters are not too hot either when it comes to figuring out where the coveys hang out.

Some coveys will fool the best and most experienced upland game bird hunters. I happen to know a hunter who has guided for a number of years and has two good pointers at his disposal. He owns one of them. Last fall he was out with two Americans looking for a large covey at the rear of his farm that he was welcome to if he could find them. Two hours hunting with two pointers in stubble, rough and barren didn't show a feather. In another area the same luck with a covey of 15. Late in November after the Hun season closed he was putting around looking for wildgeese and he stumbled over both coveys—a 22 and 15.

Another hunter told me he was looking over some likely goose fields after the Hun season closed. When he drove out a farmer's lane a covey of 19 ran down the road ahead of the car and a mile farther on he drove into a field and a dozen Huns got up. No one seemed to know they were there during the open season.

If the coming winter is at all favourable Hun hunters have nothing to worry about as there is an abundance of potential breeding stock in circulation as the old year of 1952 is on the verge of going out. The same applies to pheasants but non-resident hunters are not interested in pheasants... they have them at home.

For the Islanders Travis and Brklacich were the best of the defense. Pawlyshyn and Gordon were the pick of the forwards. The Atlantics played without Hughie Campbell, Ford, McPhee and Bergeron while the Islanders were short Orval Lavell.
