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The two men came down south of Karaganda, an industrial town in Kazakhstan. A Tass correspondent interviewed the pair inside the house where they were resting.

The room was hot and Popovich said "my word, in space it was a much cooler and less noisy."

Popovich said "the main reason for our success was that the program has been fulfilled and that we have achieved a world record to achieve a pair of eyes on a word, everything is fine."

Later they talked with Soviet Premier Khrushchev by phone, renewing an acquaintance they made in space by radio.
