Breaking-up Communist Block To Be Considered

WASHINGTON (AP)—One of the foreign policy questions to be decided by the President in the coming year is what strategy the United States would follow to promote a further break-up of the once powerfully centralized Communist bloc.

The issue may become a controversy in the presidential election year. One question debated by diplomatic officials in private conferences at the state department is how far the eastern European countries can loosen their ties with the Soviet bloc.

That was in 1948, when President Truman's administration rejected Stalin's efforts to force the United States to accept the terms of the Yalta agreement.

least \$3,000,000,000 in encouraging Communist governments to take and hold nationalist positions either in spite of Moscow policies or to the fullest extent Moscow will allow.

In both Yugoslavia and Poland, the pulling away from Moscow was accompanied by a series of steps which the United States applauded. The Poles abolished collectivization, stopped jamming U.S. radio broadcasts and allowed the Roman Catholic Church a greater degree of recognition and autonomy.

Senator Barry Goldwater, according to the presidential election at the Republican national convention: "We must make clear that until its goals of conquest are absolutely renounced, and its relations with all nations tempered, communism and the governments it controls will be an ever-present danger to our free world."
