### DAIRY AND COW.

It is estimated that in the German empire there are 7,500,000 milk cows.

All young mammals for a period of one to three years subsist entirely upon milk.

In 1887 Mulhall estimated the number of cattle in the United States at 49,500,000.

In Holland the average product for cows is 89 pounds of butter and 180 pounds of cheese per annum.

The Jersey cattle were imported into this country in considerable numbers early in the present century.

The first imports of cattle to America were made by Columbus in 1493, who brought over a bull and several cows.

The Argentine Republic is the greatest cattle raising country in South America, having in 1887 raised 22,870,000 head.

Butter is frequently mentioned in the Old Testament Scriptures, but the best Biblical scholars now regard the Hebrew word translated butter as meaning cream.

Chevreul, the famous French chemist, says that cow's butter is composed of stearin, margaric and oleic, with small quantities of butyric, caproic and capric.

Schabzigerkase is made in the canton of Glarus, Switzerland, of curd which has been fermented. It is mixed with the pulverized dried flowers of schabzkerle and pressed in a mold.

The best chemical authorities state that it is not necessary for the cream to become sour before churning. Sweet cream will produce butter in as large quantities as sour cream, and in many cases a better quality of butter.—St. Louis Globe-Democrat.
