

**Huge Project
Is Scheduled
For Manitoba**

WINNIPEG (CP) — One of North America's biggest earth-moving operations will begin about Sept. 21 when giant shovels dig into Manitoba gumbo to start the Greater Winnipeg floodway.

The multi-million dollar ditch will transform the face of Manitoba. Along its 30 mile route from St. Norbert, south of Winnipeg, to Lockport in the north, it will dwarf the Red River. Tenders for channel digging—which ranks with the Panama Canal—have been called and will be opened Sept. 7. Provincial and federal approval is expected a few days later. Tenders stipulate operations must begin within 10 days of contract awarding and call for digging of 5,800,000 cubic yards of earth over a 1.5 mile distance in a two-year period. Location is between the Trans-Canada Highway and St. Mary's Road.

The contract calls for a base width of 500 feet and a width of 1,000 feet at the top with a six to one slope. Cost of the floodway is estimated at \$63,200,000 with the federal government contributing 65 per cent. It is part of the Assiniboine-Red River water control project and \$83,000,000 flood control and water conservation program.

**Plane Delivery
Slated Aug. 24**

MONCTON (CP) — Maritime Central Airway said here the first of two Dart Herald aircraft will be delivered to the airline the weekend of Aug. 24. The twin-engine turbo-prop aircraft have been purchased from the Handley Page Company in Britain at a cost of \$1,600,000 each. The second plane is expected to arrive the end of August. The 46-seat aircraft will be put into service on MCA's Edward Island and northern Canada routes in September. They will be based in Moncton.

**X-15 Brain Fails,
Pilot Takes Over**

LOS ANGELES (AP) — The X-15's electronic brain went berserk at 100,000 feet Tuesday, forcing pilot Joseph A. Walker to switch to manual control to stabilize the bucking rocket re-search plane. The U.S. space agency pilot described the motion the plane went through after the guidance failure as a "dutch roll"—a simultaneous rolling and yawing. That is, it veered rapidly right and left, with the wings simultaneously rolling up and down.

The trouble came as Walker was descending from a 3,748 miles-an-hour flight to 197,000 feet. The roll damper can be reset in the cockpit, but Walker had no time to waste. He immediately began operating the plane by hand.

**Too Few Workers
Is N.Z. Problem**

VANCOUVER (CP)—New Zealand's employment problem is one of too many jobs, says John S. Reid, New Zealand high commissioner to Canada.

He said in an interview his country is actively seeking immigrants to bolster the work force. At least 400 were unemployed in New Zealand out of a work force of about 1,800,000.

He said the main factor in his country's low unemployment level is a climate which does away with winter unemployment.

**Buenos Aires
Has Power,
Food Problem**

BUENOS AIRES (AP) — Argentina's capital has mobilized to meet food and power shortages that have gripped one-third of greater Buenos Aires since a power station fire Saturday.

Emergency power units were brought into the city's key industrial and meat packing district, where 2,500,000 people live and work. The navy said some ships would steam for Buenos Aires to hook their power generators into the city system.

President Jose Maria Guido met with his cabinet to plan relief measures. Temporarily pushed into the background was the crisis that threatened the cabinet itself in the aftermath of a struggle for influence between factions of the armed forces.

Defence Minister Jose Luis Castillo did not attend the cabinet.

MIGS HIT POST
ISTANBUL (Reuters) — Two MIG jet fighters from northern Iraq machine-gunned a Turkish post near the Turkish-Iraq border Wednesday, killing one Turk and injuring two, Turkish officials said. The gendarmes were reported to have returned the fire but with no success.

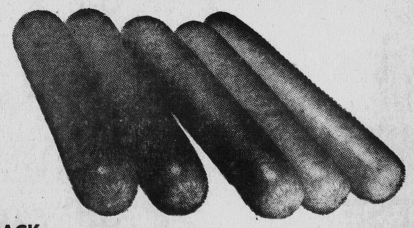
