ACCIDENT AT MONCTON. A Child's Terrible Death.

MONCTON, May 12. A young child of Joseph Bedford, of the I. C. R. shops, met with a sad and fatal accident yesterday. The little one upset a can containing a quantity of paraffine oil, and while its mother was preparing to wipe up the fluid the child got a burning stick from the stove and set fire to the oil on the floor and also to its clothing which was saturated with oil.

Father and Daughter Killed.

SPRINGFIELD, May 12. William G. Butterworth, aged 70, has committed suicide by shooting himself through the head with a rifle. His daughter Emma, aged 23, while trying to prevent her father from doing the rash act, received the bullet in her brain after it passed through his head, and died soon after. Insanity is supposed to have been the cause of the rash act.

Fireman Killed.

MONTRÉAL, May 12. During a fire last night at the Royal Waters proof Co's establishment, at which \$10,000 damage was done, a stone fell from the building and killed John Bourke, a fireman.

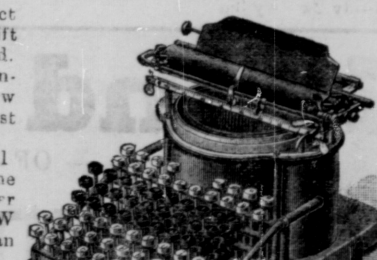
