# Police Planning Installation Of More Parking Meters

Traffic Inspector A. J. (Gus) Dowling and his street measuring crew of city police officers, last evening were busy with the marking off of streets, within the boundaries of Prince, Elizabeth, King and Queen streets, in preparation for additional parking meters.

The inspector pointed out that the work being continued on the evenings, as the daytime vehicle and pedestrian traffic was almost impossible to carry out the job efficiently.

He could not say last night just how many new meters will be installed, "that will be determined by the police committee," he said.

All the streets which were recommended for metering in the Municipal report are to be measured and marked off, but it is likely that the installing of

the meters on all streets will not be carried out this year.

When the marking has been completed, the committee will then conduct an inspection of the work, and then decide which streets or blocks are to get the meters.
