Yvon Durelle Trains Grimly For Crack At World Crown

MONTREAL (CP) — Yvon Durelle trained grimly yet confidently in a Montreal gym Tuesday for his crack at the world heavyweight boxing crown in the two-hour session was he said:
"I'm ready anytime. I wish the fight was tomorrow. I'll take it."
The "him" is Archie Lee Moore, reigning champion of San Diego, Calif., who was due in Montreal early Wednesday for the fight which goes on Dec. 10 in the Montreal Forum.
Moore, the agile and ageless, will train at the same north-end gym as Durelle. The champion's first workout is to be held Wednesday afternoon while Tuesday's is the second in the Montreal gym.
"I weigh about 174 pounds," said Durelle, the poker-faced fisherman from Baie Ste. Anne, N.B., who holds the British Empire heavyweight title. "I'll go into the ring at about that weight." The limit is 175 pounds.
NEWSREEL SHOW
At this session Tuesday Durelle, dressed in black tights and a T-shirt as grimy as his two-day beard, warmed up before television and newsreel cameras. Then he boxed six rounds with sparring partners, punched the heavy bag, skipped rope and did calisthenics.
About 100 spectators including two off-duty police constables, loafers and boxing fans, watched Durelle go through the paces. Earlier he had done road work and when the gym session was through headed for his hotel to rest and wait for the next day's training round.
He went three rounds with Tommy Hough, former United States amateur light-heavyweight champion. Hough, 20 and fast, was used to give 29-year-old Durelle a workout in blocking punches.
"Yvon can't back up," explained manager Chris Shaban. "So we'll probably fight him down in a crouch. Yvon's a slow starter and I'll worry about him for the first four or five rounds."
RESPECTS DURELLE
"He'll give Moore a hard time," predicted sparring mate Hough. "That Durelle's a hard puncher."
The fisherman went another three rounds with Nat Dixon, 22-year-old heavyweight who looks

like a young Joe Louis and who once sparred with heavyweight champion Floyd Patterson.
"We use Dixon to make Yvon work harder," said Shaban. "He's a heavyweight and can cover up beautifully. Yvon says he finds him very hard to hit."
Durelle next moved to the 100-pound punching bag for three more rounds, making it pop and jump as he worked. Then it was on to three rounds of skipping.
Doing calisthenics with a medicine ball on a floor mat, Durelle had a complaint:
"This is too easy. The ball's too light. I wish I had the other

Strike Threatened In I.L. On Rejection Of Pension

WASHINGTON (AP) — The threat of a baseball player strike arose Tuesday as the International League club owners rejected demands for a pension program.

Frank H. Horton, president of the Rochester club, announced that league directors have decided the estimated cost of more than \$250,000 for pensions was too much.

The plan was proposed by James P. Durante, a New York attorney representing the International League Players Association.

Horton told a news conference that Durante told the owners: "You will accept this plan or you will not have International League baseball."

Horton said Durante started pension talks last summer and finally came up with a plan that would cost about \$293,000 a year. Of this the players would contribute between \$36,000 and \$37,000. Club owners would put up a maximum of \$256,000 even if the cost of the pension contract increased.

Benefits would equal about two-thirds of those provided in the major league pension program.

DELIVERS ULTIMATUM
Durante met with league directors Tuesday morning and delivered them what Horton termed an ultimatum.

Frank Shaughnessy, league president, called the news conference at which Horton acted as spokesman for the directors.

Horton said Durante had claimed almost 100 per cent membership of I.L. players in August. Personnel has shifted since that time.

"We intend to operate the league and play baseball in 1959," Horton said.

Players shuttle in and out of the league's teams most of which have links with major league organizations.

Horton said Durante started pension talks last summer and finally came up with a plan that would cost about \$293,000 a year. Of this the players would contribute between \$36,000 and \$37,000. Club owners would put up a maximum of \$256,000 even if the cost of the pension contract increased.
